ZIGZAG RANGER DISTRICT SKIING

Spring and summer skiing can be a rewarding experience if the skier goes prepared to meet weather and snow conditions. Chairlifts and snowcats provide the spring skier with access to the beautiful upper slopes. Polma lifts at Timberline are in place and operating. Snow above the 6000' level is still good for Cross Country skiing and snow shoeing; snowmobiling however is fine for the season.

MOUNTAIN CLIMBING

We should again like to urge all climbers to sign the Climbers Register at Timberline before starting their climb, and most of all, be sure to sign in again when you return. In addition, notify a relative or friend at home that you intend to climb and report back to them when you return. These people are usually the first to realize you are missing. The register at Timberline is checked daily, if you fail to sign in upon return from a climb, it

is presumed you have not returned and a search is begun. We would also urge that inexperienced climbers or those without adequate equipment limit their climbing to the lower elevations, or climb only with experienced climbing groups.

CAMPGROUNDS

With camping season upon us and campgrounds filling to capacity each weekend, we ask that all campers remember Forest Service campgrounds are on a "first come - first served" basis. Don't save a spot for a friend.

Riley, 11 Tent, Water
Tollgate, 14 Tent, 8 Trailer, Water
Barlow and Twin Bridges are not designed for trailer use, they are rugged low elevation campgrounds with no water. Zigzag Ranger District will start charging in their campgrounds on June 16th.

TRAILS

Plaza and Hunchback trails are now open to the view points listed in Don Low's book. Cool Creek and Zigzag Mtn. are partially open, as is Pacific Crest in the Sandy River and Muddy Fork area. Other Trails open: Castle Canyon, 765, Flag Mountain, 766, Old Salmon River 742B, Salmon River 742, Still Creek 780, Pioneer Bridge Trail 795, and Ramona Falls Loop 797.

FISHING

Trillium Lake access is finally open and the lake is being stocked. The boat ramp and dam roads are open. The Campground is still under snow, however, and will not be open for use until about June 16th. Water in the Sandy and Salmon rivers is high and murky.

Snow level is now about 3800 feet.

Ace R. Koch is among the many students to graduate from Oregon State University on May 4. Ace and family are well known at Cottrell where they formerly lived.

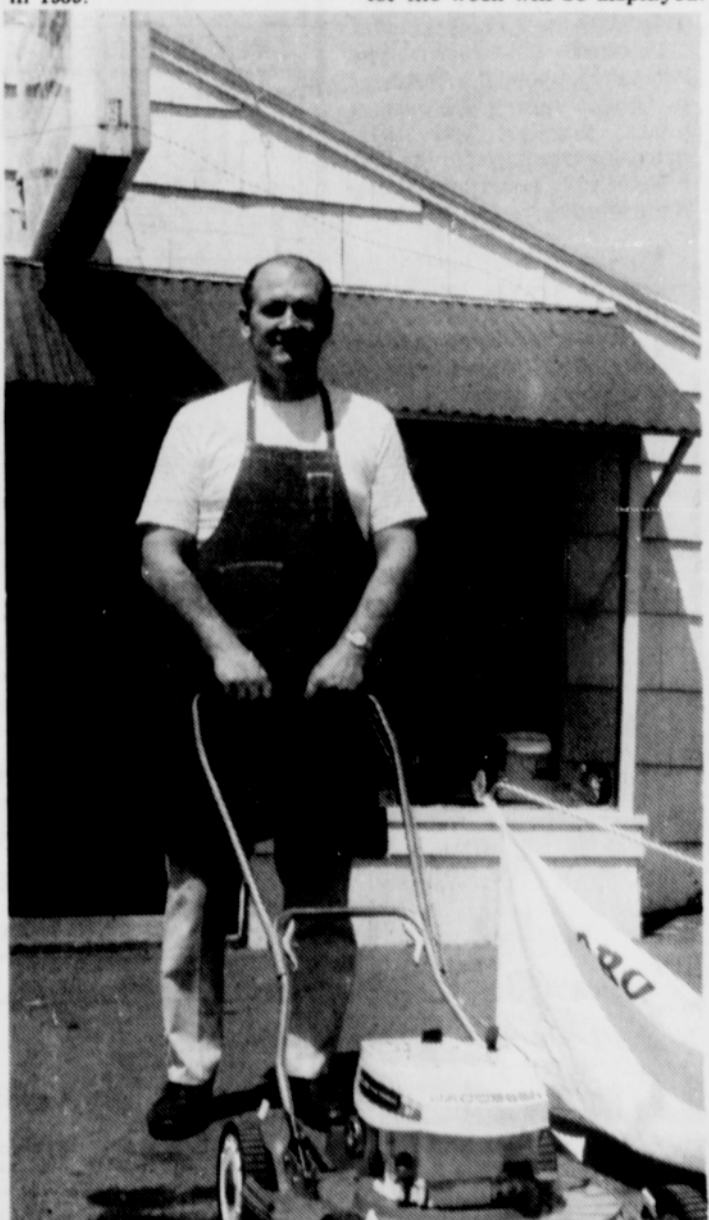
