Expenditure survey gets underway

A federal survey of daily family expenditures will get under way in this area this week, according to Richard E. Nagel, supervisor of the survey area office in Seattle, Wash.

Selected households will be asked to keep a daily record of expenditures for two weeks, Nagel said.

Called the dairy survey, it is a part of the Consumer Expenditure Program which is being conducted here and throughout the country by the Bureau of the Census.

The overall Consumer Expenditure Program will provide facts about today's buying habits to update the Consumer Price Index which measures monthly price changes.

Each interviewer carries a red, white, and blue identification card bearing his or her signature and photograph, and each has sworn to the Census Bureau's oath of confidentiality.

All information reported remains in strictest confidence, Nagel said.
