## Recreation areas open for July 4 weekend

The Zig Zag Ranger District reports that an ecology clean-up project got rid of litter from the mountain side and roads in the area.

Areas that the two ranger districts report open are as follows:

#### TRAILS

The following trails are open to use in the Clackamas Ranger District:

Elk Lake, 559; Round Lake, 565; Alder Flat, 574; Shellrock, 700; Fish Lake, 717; Riverside, 723; Anvil Lake, 724; Pyramid Lake, 727; and Buck Lake, 728.

The only trails that have been maintained are Alder Flat and Riverside.

Trails closed to motor vehicle use are Elk Lake, Round Lake, Alder Flat, Fish Lake, and Riverside.

The Zig Zag Ranger District reports that the following trails are open:

Castle Canyon, 765; Flag Mountain, 766; Mirror Lake, 664; Pioneer Bridge, 795; Ramona, 797; Salmon River, 742; Old Salmon River, 742b; and Still Creek, 780.

The Yokum Ridge Trail is

open only two miles above the falls. Both the Horseshoe Ridge-Cast loop and the Horseshoe Ridge-ZigZag Mountain loop are open and free of snow. They have been maintained except upon the high ridge crest.

Plaza Trail, 783, is open from Welches up, and from the Douglas campsite up to Wildcat Lookout and Wildcat viewpoint to Plaza Junction. Snowbanks between Douglas camp and the lookout site should be melted.

#### CAMPGROUNDS

The following campgrounds are open in the Clackamas district:

Alder Flat, pack-it-out garbage program and no water; Ripplebrook, fee area and piped water; Rainbow, fee area and piped water; Riverside, fee area and no water; Riverford, no water; Shellrock Creek, pack-it-out garbage program and no water; and Two Rivers, no water.

All other campgrounds are closed by snow.

These campgrounds are open in the Zig Zag district:

Camp Creek, Green Canyon, McNeil, Tollgate, Riley, Barlow, Twin Bridges, and Devil's Meadow. Barlow, Twin Bridges, and Devil's Meadow have no water.

#### ANGLING

The Clackamas River continues to be high and angling success is good. Fish taken range in length from 10 to 13 inches.

The Oak Grove fork of the Clackamas River also continues to be high and fishing success is improving. Fish taken range in length from 9 to 12 inches.

At Lake Harriet angling success is rated as good. Trout taken range from 11 to 15 inches in length.

Fishing success is still rated as good in the Collawash River. Trout taken average 10 inches in length.

## Rose track meet repeat in doubt

Last weekend's Rose Festival Track Meet at Mt. Hood Community College was an artistic success but a financial failure.

Best estimates are that the Rose Festival Assn., sponsors of the meet, dropped between \$5,000 and \$10,000.

Such losses make future Rose Festival track meets rather speculative although the Association has made no definite decision regarding next year.

Festival officials were lavish in their praise of the Mt. Hood facility, saying it was one of the finest anywhere. However, persistent rainfall Saturday kept the crowd down to not more than 3,000.

The meet had been held at Madison high school in Portland for the last three years but was shifted to Mt. Hood because of the better facilities and parking available.

In each of the three earlier meets, CBS television had covered the proceedings. This year, however, the summer series was cancelled, including Gerber Reservoir area. The coverage of the Rose Festival meet.

Another factor which may have kept Saturday's attendance down was the \$5 charge for reserved-seat tickets.

## Hunting

Time is running out for hunters interested in 1972 antelope, bighorn sheep, or the Jackson and Josephine agricultural deer seasons, all of which are hunted by special tag or permit.

According to rules adopted by the Game Commission, hunters have until July 11 to submit applications if they wish to be included in the drawings. Applications received after the deadline will not be included and will be processed only if surplus tags or permits remain. The drawing is scheduled July 21.

A total of 1,430 antelope tags is authorized for 16 antelope hunting areas. Fifty tags will also be issued to archers in the Gerber Reservoir area. The antelope season is set for Aug. 19 - 23.

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
