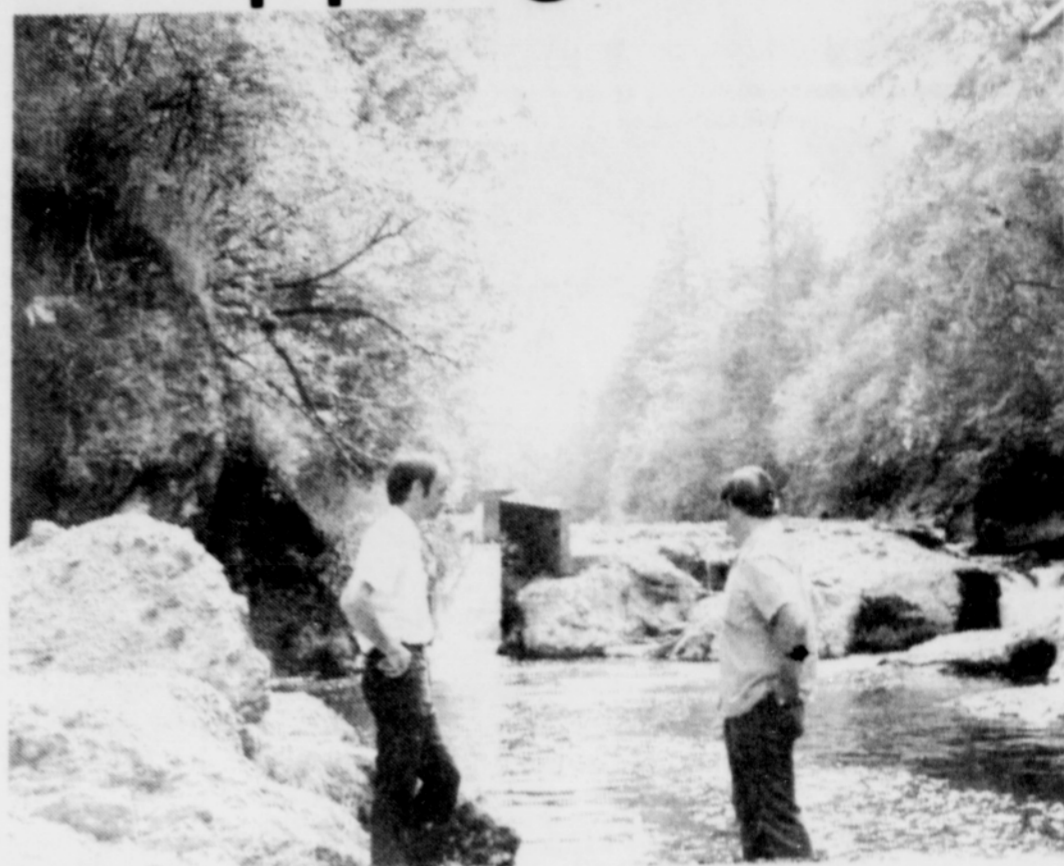

NW Seniors meet near

Some 75 cindermen aged 30 and over will convene this weekend at Mt. Hood Community College for the annual Northwest Seniors Track and Field meet.

Entrants from Canada, Washington, Oregon, California, Montana and

Hawaii will open competition at 6 p.m. Saturday in the 30-39, 40-49, 50-59, 60-and-over age groups.

Action will start with shot put, long jump and high jump finals and Sunday's competition will begin at 5 p.m.

The three-day affair will windup with a marathon run Monday morning beginning at 7 p.m.

Meet director Jim Puckett says a number of well-known local spikers will be in the forefront, including Lynn Eves, Jim McAbee, Jay Hill and Don McMillan in the 30-39 age group.

George Puterbaugh will return to run in the 40-49 group events, along with Art Afremow and Jack Coy. The ever-popular Cmr. Bud

Deacon will be back in the 60-and-over division, from capturing wins last year in the pole vault, high jump, long jump and triple jump, plus a second in the javelin.

Russ Niblock will again compete in the 50-59 age bracket, having earned 440-yd. dash and halfmile victories last year plus a second in the 100 and 200-yd. dashes.

Competition in the 30-39 age group is a new light for this year's meet, which will see medals awarded to the top three finishers in each event and outstanding track and field men chosen from each group.

Admission prices will be \$1 for adults, 50 cents for children and may be obtained at the MHCC Community Services

office prior to the meet.

Tickets will also be on sale at the gate and a special, no-host barbecue will be held at the college Saturday night following completion of the first day's competition. Price of the barbecue tickets is \$2.50.

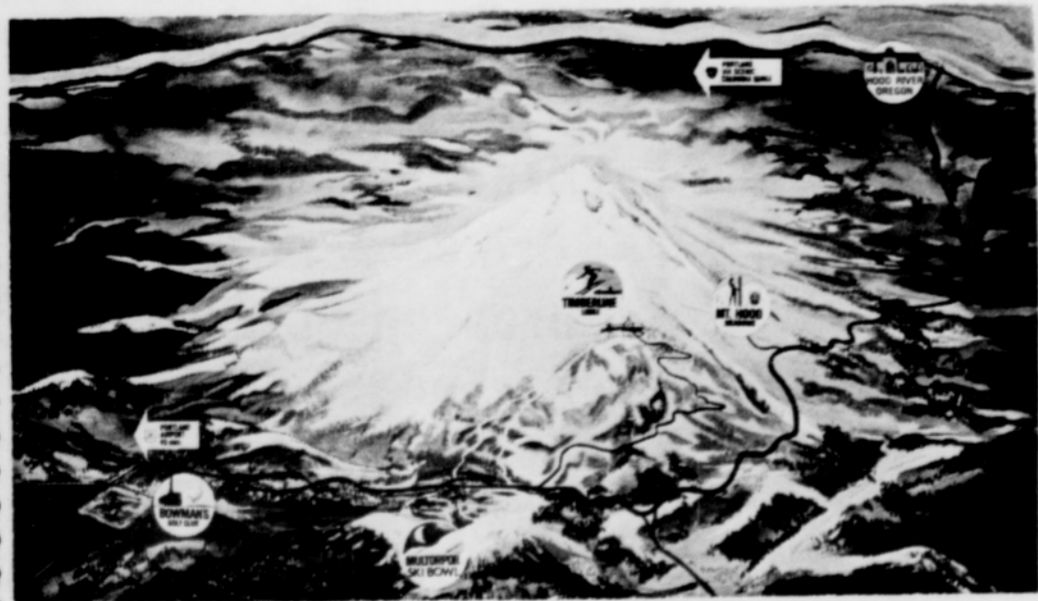
