Public barbecue slated at Mt. Hood CC campus

Mr. Hood Community College's second annual Western Barbecue & Hoe-Down is scheduled for Friday, July 28, at the barbecue pit next to the lake.

More than 700 community citizens, college staff and students turned out for the inaugural event last summer.

Dr. Earl L. Klapstein, Mt. Hood president, called it "...one of the best community-supported events we've had in the history of the college."

The Western Barbecue & Hoe-Down features an inexpensive dinner and various forms of entertainment for the entire family.

It all gets underway at 6 p.m.

The menu includes a 12 oz. T-Bone steak dinner with all the trimmings (salad, chips, desert, coffee, milk and soft drinks) for \$2. Also available will be a 1/4 pound hamburger sandwich with assorted trimmings for \$1.

Many forms of entertainment are planned including games, square dancing and cartoons for the children.

Shell Oil denied service station site

Shell Oil Company was denied a zone change Thursday night by Gresham city council which would have permitted a service station and car wash on Burnside.

The location is on the north side of the street and adjacent to the future north-south street, Eastman or 221st.

The action was taken after the planning commission had previously recommended against the project. The planners said there was already enough service stations in the area.

The property in question is part of an 8-acre tract which has been promoted for commercial development by Speck

Enterprises. The future of the development may now be stymied.

In other action the council approved a zone change to permit multiple dwellings and commercial services on a 47-acre tract northeast of Burnside and Division-Hogan Road.

The petitioner was Exchange Development.

The council passed a resolution to accept S. Main Ave. from Powell Blvd. south to the railway tracks from Multnomah County. The city will receive \$14,000 from the county, however, the city then must maintain the street. It will be intergrated into the Johnson Creek Park site.
