## Firemen report losses

Gresham fire department answered nine fire calls and 21 first aid calls during the month of June. Total fire loss was estimated at \$6,685 with the largest that of an auto valued at \$4,800.

Fireman referred to a National Fire Protection Association record which shows that almost a third of the children who die in fires are those who have been left at home alone.

He was promoted to detective in 1963 and was assigned to homicide and robbery.

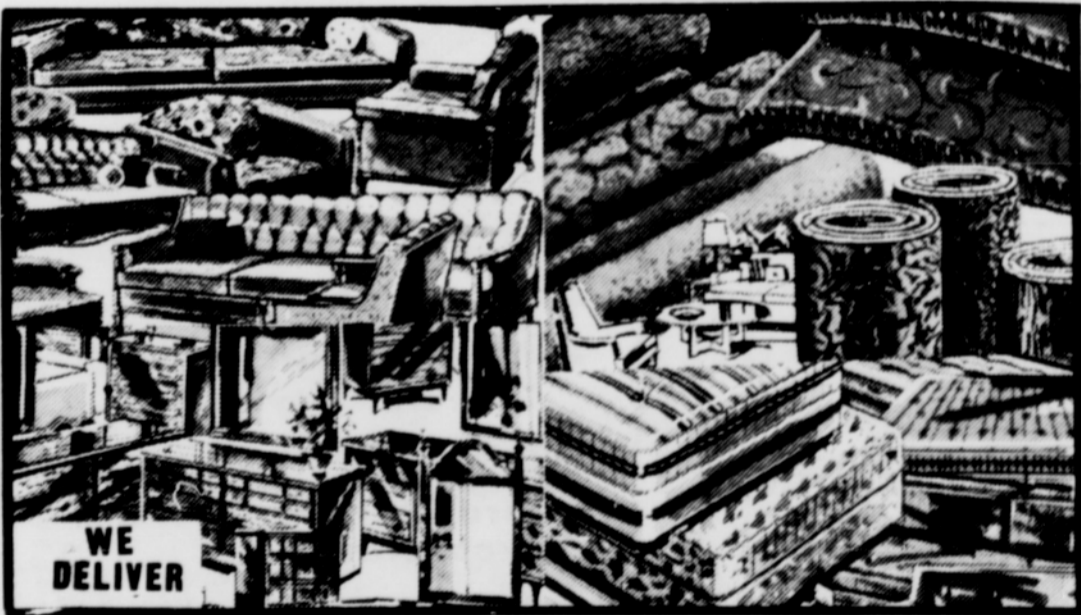
Richard Stensrud, a former state policeman who joined the sheriff's office in 1961 also retired. He had been assigned to the courthouse jail.
