In the Matter of Calling a Hearing on the Appeal of the Temporary Permit application of GEORGE H. EN- TENMANN, having been denied by the Board of Adjustment to renew the permit to use a travel trailer as a temporary residence pending construction of a permanent residence on property located on the south side of Cedar Drive, Brightwood Area.
Appellant: GEORGE H. EN- TENMANN

This matter coming regularly before the Board of County Commissioners to be heard, and it appearing to the Board that George H. Entenmann made application to the Clackamas County Board of Adjustment for a temporary permit on property described as Tax Lot 1401, Section 22B, T2S, R6E.

It further appearing to the Board that said application was heard at a scheduled meeting of the Clackamas County Board of Adjustment on the 5th day of June, 1972, at which time the Board made a motion to deny the request on the basis that the applicant has no definite building plans, and also it is within a possible flood plain area.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the hearing in the above matter be held on the 26th day of July, 1972, at the hour of 10:00 A.M. in Room 201, County Courthouse, Oregon City, Oregon, to afford the general public an opportunity to be heard on the above appeal, and

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the County Clerk is hereby directed to publish a notice of said hearing in the Sandy Post, a newspaper of general circulation in the County, on the 13th day of July, 1972.

Sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned until 8:00 o'clock p.m. on the 1st day of August 1972, and immediately thereafter will be publicly opened by the District School Board of School District No. 46, Clackamas County, Oregon, for the purchase of four lots, less than one and accrued interest, of the following described negotiable general obligation coupon bonds of the bonds of the County of Clackamas, Oregon, to-wit:

The bonds of the issue that mature after December 1, 1982, will be redeemed at the option of the school district in regular numerical order at par and accrued interest upon December 1, 1982 and upon any interest date thereafter.

The bonds will bear interest payable semiannually on June 1 and December 1 at such rate or rates, in multiples of four tenths (4/10) or one tenth (1/10) of 1%, not exceeding a net effective rate of seven (7) percent per annum, as shall be specified by resolution of the Board. The bonds shall have but one coupon for the interest due on any interest-paying date. Both the principal of and the interest upon the bonds will be paid at the office of the county treasurer of Clackamas County, Oregon, at Oregon City, Oregon.

The bonds will be sold to the highest bidder, but the district school board reserves the right to reject any or all bids. Unless all bids are rejected, the bonds will be awarded to the bidder complying with the terms of the notice of sale, and submitting the bid which, if none of the bonds are called for redemption prior to the final maturity date thereof, provides the lowest cost to the school district.

Each bid must be unconditional, must be accompanied by a certified check or cashier's check in favor of the district, or upon a bank doing business in the State of Oregon, in the sum of \$17,500.00, and must be enclosed in a sealed envelope addressed to the undersigned and marked on the outside "Proposal for the sale of the bonds of the school district against any loss resulting from failure of the bidder to comply with the terms of his bid."

The successful bidder will be furnished, without cost, with the approved opinion of the County of Rankin, Walsh and Regen, printed on the reverse side of the bonds at the expense of the district, to the effect that the bonds are valid and legally binding general obligations of the Clackamas County School District No. 46, and, unless paid from ad valorem taxes levied upon all of the taxable real property within the district without limitation as to rate or amount under present laws. The firm will also furnish a statement in such approving opinion that they have taken into account the provisions of the law of the State of Oregon, including the provisions of the present system of financing public school purposes, and that it does not modify or qualify the conclusions stated in their opinion. The successful bidder shall be conditioned on the availability and delivery of the bonds, which certificate will make reference to the litigation referred to above and will state the issue is not a party to such litigation.

The bonds will be delivered complete, without undue delay, at the expense of the school district, at such city in Oregon as the successful bidder shall name.

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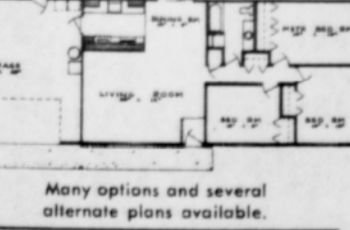
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During 1970 (the most recent figures available) the average worker suffered 14.6 disability days — which means he was healthy about 96 per cent of the time.
