

Sandy swimmers edged by Oregon City team

In the eight and under division were Erica Neuenfeldt and Jeff Bowman. Erica brought in points for two first places, and a second place. Jeff scored in the boys 50 yard

freestyle, the 25 yard breaststroke, and the 25 yard backstroke.

Swimming in the ten and under division were Debbie Bowman and Doug Miller. Debbie captured third place in two events and Doug grabbed third place in three events.

Katie Neuenfeldt and Gary Roth were two of the Blue Marlin swimmers in the 11 and 12 year old category. Katie placed second in three of her events and was a member of a winning relay team. Gary scored two third places.

In the 13 and 14 year old division were Joanne Cyphers and Chris Roth. Jo took two first places and one second

place by a judge's decision. Chris captured first place in the boys 100 yard backstroke, the 100 yard butterfly, and the 200 yard freestyle.

Swimming for the Blue Marlin in the Senior division were Lori Anderson and Steve Roth. Lori scored first in three of her events and Steve took a first place, a second place, and was a member of the Senior boys winning relay team.

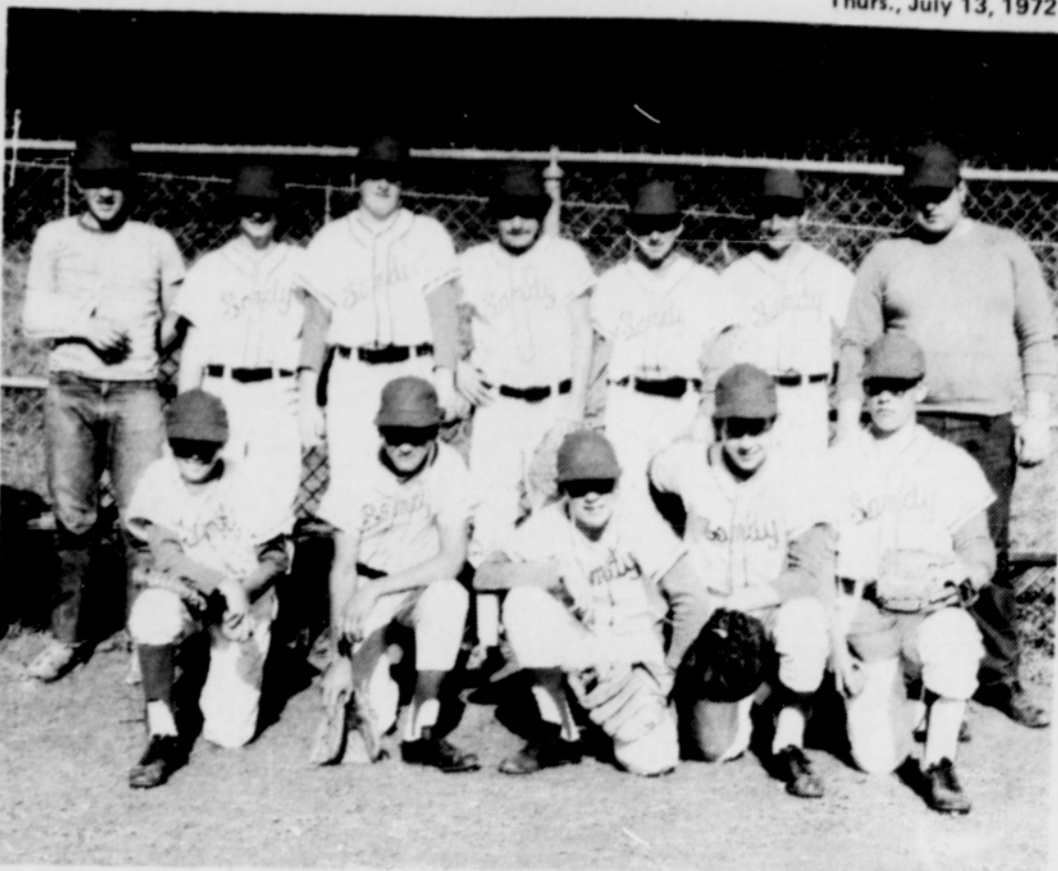

OREGON STATE GAME COMMISSION

Big game hunting rule books are now available. Hunters may obtain copies at any license agency. All big game seasons for 1972 are listed in the booklet as are rules on arms and ammunition, possession and transportation of game animals, and other general regulations.

Nimrods are urged to check carefully on the procedures required to apply for special tags and permits. Instructions will be found in the booklet. Hunters are also reminded that to be eligible for the drawings, applications for special tags and permits must be received at the Game Commission's Portland headquarters by 5 p.m. on the filing deadline date.

The rule does not mean that hunters cannot file applications after the deadline, but with the great interest in these special hunts, it's doubtful late applicants will have much chance. Only if surplus tags or permits are available following the drawings will late applications be considered.

Sheriff warns boaters

A crack down on boaters and floaters without life preservers was announced Monday by Clackamas County Sheriff Joe Shobe.

The Oregon state law requires that persons floating the river in boats, rafts or tubes have a life preserver, he said.

Water accidents on rivers in Clackamas County have resulted in two deaths and two injuries this year. Over the July 4 holiday there were eight citations and 43 warnings on violators.

Boaters and floaters should know the river and refrain from floating into unknown areas of white water, Sheriff Shobe said.
