NEVER-FAIL CANDY CRUNCH

2 (6-oz.) pkgs. Butterscotch morsels.

HOT RICE DISH

1 lb. ground meat (Chuck)
½ cup uncooked rice
1 can chicken noodle soup
1 can mushroom soup
1½ cups diced celery
2 medium onions
2 tablespoons soy sauce
Brown meat, onion and celery. Add soups with equal amounts of water, bring to a boil, add uncooked rice and soy sauce. Put in greased baking dish. Bake for 1 hour at 350 degrees. Serves 8-10. —From the files of Mrs. Walter Gaffner, Pocatello, Idaho.

PINEAPPLE BRAN MUFFINS

1 cup all-bran cereal
½ cup milk
1 cup crushed pineapple
¼ cup raisins
¼ cup shortening
1 egg
1 cup all-purpose flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
½ teaspoon salt
¼ teaspoon soda
½ cup golden brown sugar, firmly packed

Combine all-bran, milk, pineapple and raisins. Add shortening and egg; mix well. Combine flour, baking powder, salt, and soda and brown sugar. Add to first mixture and mix until dampened. Divide dough evenly between paper lined muffin cups. Bake in 400 degree oven 25 to 30 minutes. Makes 12 muffins. —From the files of Mrs. Howard W. Berger, Sandy.

PINEAPPLE ICE BOX PIE

1 can of Sweetened Condensed Eagle Brand Milk
2 eggs (separated)
1 lemon (juice only)
1 small can crushed pineapple (drained)

½ box of vanilla wafers
Pour condensed milk in bowl, add beaten egg yolks. Pour in lemon juice, stir a little.
