Mt. Hood forest requiring permits

The Zig Zag Ranger District has announced that permits will be required for trips in all

National Forest Wilderness in Region Six. The permits are free and

may be obtained from either the Mt. Hood Forest Supervisor's Office in Portland or at

a ranger station. The following are from reports of the Clackamas and Zig Zag Ranger Districts:

ROADS
In the Zig Zag District, all roads are open and being maintained.

In the Clackamas District, the roads to Hideaway Lake, Highrock, Timothy Lake, U.S. Highway 26, Summit Lake, Olallie Lake, Round Lake, and Detroit are open.

The Skyline Road S-42 is open to the Peninsula Campground. From Peninsula Campground south pass Breitenbush Lake to the Breitenbush River Cascades, the road is closed by snow.

TRAILS
All snow is melted on trails in the Zig Zag District except those high on Mt. Hood.

The Pacific Crest Trail from Sandy River to Timberline will be covered with snow until about Aug. 1. It is very difficult to find now and impassable to horses.

In the Clackamas District, all the trails outside of the Olallie Lake Scenic Area are open. Most of these trails have been maintained.

Trails that are open in the Olallie Lake Scenic Area area: Russ Lake, Fish Lake, Red Lake and Olallie Lake.

The Pacific Crest National Scenic Trail is open from the Northern District boundary to the junction of the Red Lake Trail. From this point south to the southern district boundary at Park Ridge, the trail is closed by snow.

CAMPGROUNDS
All of the Clackamas District campgrounds are open with the exception of Horseshoe Lake and Breitenbush Lake, which are closed by snow.

In the Zig Zag District, all campgrounds except Phlox Point and Alpine are now open and maintained.

The following fee campgrounds are open: McNeil, Green Canyon, Tollgate, Camp Creek, Still Creek, and Trillium Lake.

No-fee campgrounds open include Riley and Clear Creek Picnic Grounds.

ANGLING
Angling in the Clackamas River is rated as good.

The river was stocked this last week and fishermen have been taking trout ranging in length from 10 to 13 inches. Most of the fish have been taken with eggs.

In the Collawash River, anglers have been taking fish from 10 to 12 inches in length on eggs and lures. Fishing success is rated as fair.

Fishermen have been catching trout ranging in length from 10 to 15 inches in Lake Harriet. Trout taken have been caught on eggs, lures and worms.

In Olallie Lake, some fish up to 20 inches have been taken. Most of the fish have been taken by trolling. Fishing success ranges from fair to good.

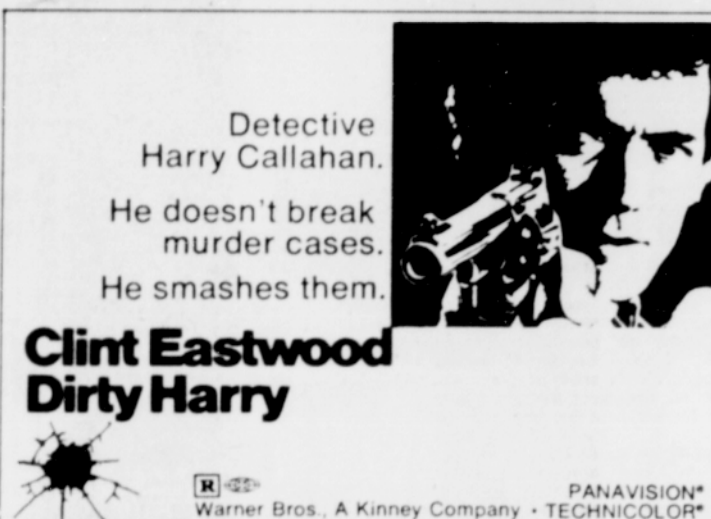
