After his graduation in 1971 he began working for his father at the Sandy Cycle Center as a motor cycle mechanic.

Richard was an active member of the Hilltopper Motor Cycle Club. In 1971 he was given the "Most Active Member Award" by the club. Survivors include his father: John Baxter, Sandy; mother: Nettie Rectar, Montana; brother: Rodney Baxter, Maryland; sister: Sherry Rhoades, Tillamook; and grandmother: Fern Baxter, Albany.

Funeral services were held in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home on September 19. Interment was at Firhill Memorial Cemetery, Sandy.

Dean Iron Cloud

Dean Russel Iron Cloud, 25, a life long resident of the Gresham area, died Sept. 7 in Mill Valley, Calif. in an accident.

Iron Cloud was born in Portland, the son of Thomas and Elizabeth Iron Cloud. He spent his entire life in the Gresham-Sandy area. He attended Orient Grade School and Gresham High School. After leaving high school, he moved to the San Francisco area and resided there until his death Sept. 7.

Funeral services for Iron Cloud were Wednesday, Sept. 20, at 1:30 p.m. at the Bateman Funeral Chapel in Gresham. Interment followed at Forest Lawn Cemetery in Gresham.

Students prepare for tests

Seniors and Sophomores who attend Sandy Union High School will have a holiday, Tuesday, Sept. 26, while students in the Freshman and Junior classes will be scratching their heads, as they participate in the annual Achievement Testing Program. The school buses will run on their regular routes at the normal time, that day.

The tests are designed by the Metro Area Test Board for the purpose of comparing "Johnnie Jones" as a tenth grader with the same "Johnnie Jones" as an eleventh grader. The test is not designed to compare two different students directly to each other. The test may be used to evaluate how well a student is progressing as compared to the average students in his class.

The test for Freshmen consists of Mathematics, Composition, Reading, Science and Social Studies.

The Test for Juniors will be Math, Composition, Reading and Science.

The results should be complete and ready to discuss with the students and parents within six weeks after the testing is completed.
