

Wrestlers see winning streak end against SH

Friday night the Pioneers travel to Silverton. The Foxes are highly regarded throughout the league. The match will begin at 6 p.m.

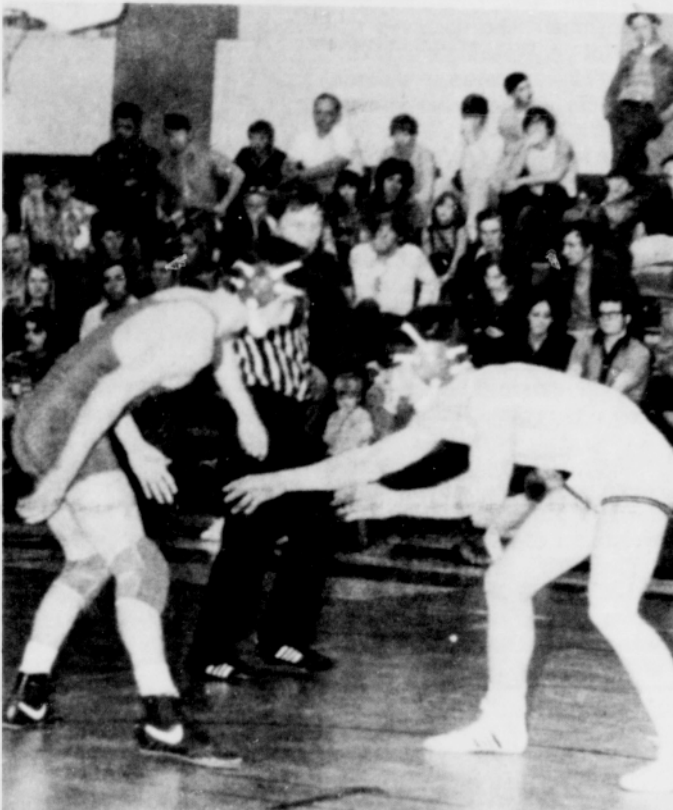
Sandy winners were Gene DeLay, Pat Dyal, Martin Richards, Casey Carmony and Eric Lundeen.

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Roadless areas urged in report

The future of some 30,000 acres of Mt. Hood National Forest occupied the attention of about 100 concerned citizens Jan. 9 at Dexter McCarty school in Gresham.

The public hearing was the second one called by the forest service to assess public opinion and present alternative plans for use of the Huckleberry Mountain unit about eight miles east of Sandy. The hearing is part of a national forest service effort to study remaining forested areas which are roadless but unprotected. The forest service will hold a third meeting in June.

Some audience concern centered on plans to build more roads into the northwest portion (Wildcat Mountain) of the area for logging purposes and for some road-associated recreation. A forest service spokesman affirmed that most of the logging would be

sustained-yield, but that there might be "some clearcutting."

Some 200 acres have already been logged, while forest service figures list another 21,000 acres in the unit as suitable for commercial logging.

Working with the forest service, the Sierra Club, the Oregon Environmental Council, the Mt. Hood Forest Study Group and the Mazamas have contributed to the planning. John Hammond, assoc. prof. of philosophy at PSU and chairman of the Mt. Hood Forest Study Group, stated that as the result of that group's survey and study, they recommended that all "roadless areas should remain unroaded" in the unit.

Other interests represented at the meeting included recreationists in camping, hiking, horseback riding, snowmobiling, motorcycling, and four-wheel drive motoring. Some were also concerned with the support of two fish hatcheries, protection of species and habitat, and preservation of the water supply.

The Huckleberry planning unit lies west of Salmon River and north of the earlier-planned Roaring River unit. Huckleberry encompasses Wildcat Mountain, Cedar Creek and the scenic Eagle Creek as some of its more notable characteristics. The area includes 30.5 miles of foot trails, eight miles of roads and two unimproved camps.

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
