

Gobbler turkey hunt set; ice fishing picking up

Shotgunners are reminded that a spring gobbler turkey season is scheduled April 28 through May 6, open to a limited number of hunters. A drawing to determine to whom the 250 available tags will be issued is scheduled for 10 a.m., Feb. 23, at the Game Commission's Portland headquarters. Bag limit is one male turkey.

To be eligible for the drawing, hunters must file an application on the Controlled Hunt Application card available at license dealers. One or two persons may file on the same card. Fees are not to be remitted with the applications. The \$2 fee will be collected from hunters successful in the drawing.

Applications are due at the Commission's Portland office by 5 p.m., Feb. 14. Late applications will not be included in the drawing.

Open area for the spring gobbler season takes in that part of the state north of U. S.

Highway 26 and east of the Cascade summit. Largest flocks of turkeys are located in Wasco County in the oak-pine forests from White River north toward The Dalles. Some nice flocks are also located in the Sled Springs area of Walla Walla County and in the Bridge Creek-Texas Bar area along the John Day.

Here's an important note for smallbore rifle fanciers. At its May hearing to establish big

game hunting regulations for 1973, the Game Commission will consider legalizing 22 centerfire rifles generating at least 900 foot pounds of energy at 100 yards for deer hunting. If the Commission approves this change it will make several smallbore centerfire rifles available for hunting deer, bear, and other of the smaller big-game animals.

At least five smallbore centerfire rifles will be legal.

These include the 220 Swift, 222 Remington, 223 Remington and 225 Winchester. Not legal would be such varminters as the 218 Bee, 219 Zipper, 22 Hornet, and others which lack the necessary 900 foot pounds of energy. Rimfire rifles would also remain unlawful for big game hunting.

Ice fishing is picking up in many lakes and impoundments in eastern Oregon.

Ice is still a little thin at both Ochoco and Prineville reservoirs. It should be pretty solid at Chickahominy, and Thompson Valley Reservoir is well worth a look, although we haven't received any report on this impoundment.

Here's a sport fish that receives very little attention, with angling at its best during the winter months. This is the whitefish, found in abundance in many streams of the

state. You can angle for this fine game fish in any stream open during the winter angling season.

A few of the best streams include the lower Deschutes, John Day, Grande Ronde, Walla and Imnaha rivers. Whitefish can be caught on flies or single eggs, but the best baits are natural insects nymphs found right in the stream.

To capture these little

wigglers take a piece of screen and hold it scoop-shaped in a rocky, shallow riffle. Turn the rocks over and the disturbed nymphs will be carried downstream by the current and will lodge against the screen.

Best way to fish is with a bobber placed three to five feet above the bait. Allow the bait to move with the current just off the bottom. The nymphs may appear to be small bits of bait but I can assure you one to a

hook is all you need. Whitefish are schooling fish so where you find one there should be many more around.
