Q. I am the widow of a deceased serviceman. Is it true that I am entitled to a Civil Service preference rating?

A. If you have not remarried, you are entitled to a Civil Service 10-point preference rating, if your husband was an honorably discharged veteran of any war as defined by Congress:

World War I: April 6, 1917 through Nov. 11, 1918.
World War II: Dec. 7, 1941 through Dec. 31, 1946.
Korean Conflict: June 27, 1950 through Jan. 31, 1955.
Post-Korean Conflict: 180 days in active duty service, any part of which occurred after Jan. 31, 1955.
Vietnam Era: Aug. 5, 1964, until ending.

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
