



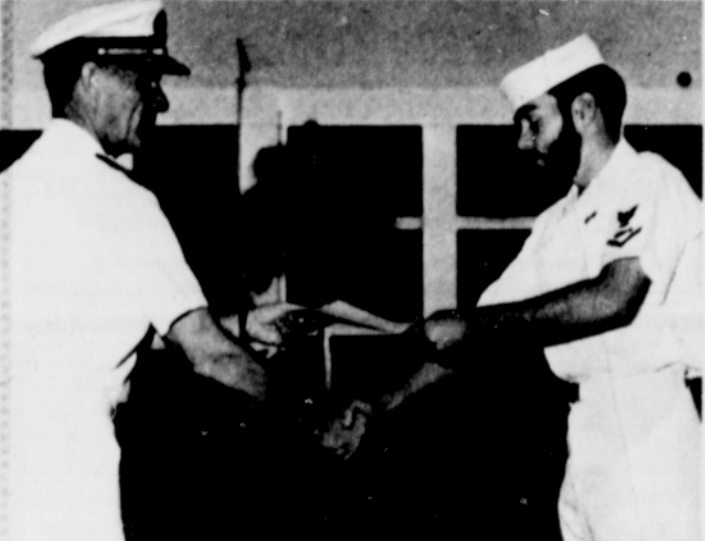

Dress code stays at Sandy grade

The recent decision by the Oregon Court of Appeals, which restricted the right of schools to enforce rules pertaining to length of students hair, will not change Sandy Grade School's present policy.

Anton A. Bryant, Grade School Superintendent, explained that the decision may be appealed at the State Supreme Court, and may not be final.

"We feel that this Appeals Court decision will be taken to the Supreme Court. In the meantime, it is up to the Grade

School Board to decide our policy," Bryant explained.

Currently, a dress code for the students, including a rule on hair length, and a grooming policy for the faculty and staff are in effect at Sandy Grade. The student dress code was written by a panel of parents, while the faculty policy was decided by faculty and staff. Both were approved by the school board.

Last week, a Sandy resident, David Park stated in a letter to the editor that he was told he

could not be used as a voluntary teacher's aide because of the length of his hair. Park, who holds a master's degree, had applied to Verne Buhler, primary principal, for a volunteer job after he heard of
