BORING WATER DISTRICT No. 24 WATER DISTRICT BOND ELECTION NOTICE

STATE OF OREGON
County of Clackamas
NOTICE is hereby given that at the BORING WATER DISTRICT No. 24 special election hereby called to be held at Boring Grade School at Boring, Oregon, Clackamas County, in said water district on the 26th day of February, 1973, between the hours of 8:00 o'clock A.M. and 8:00 o'clock P.M., Pacific Standard Time, there will be submitted to the legal voters of said water district the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of \$300,000.00 for the purpose of providing funds with which to construct reservoirs, and if necessary to drill and construct a well or wells for securing adequate supply of potable water; to construct supply lines to available sources of water; to acquire the necessary machinery to operate said well or wells or supply lines to a source of water other than wells; also to acquire real property within or without the boundaries of the said district to accomplish these purposes; also to purchase all necessary labor and material for the construction and maintenance of the supply system; the reservoirs and distribution system; also to improve, repair, lay out, construct, reconstruct, extend, enlarge or improve the Boring Water System, or to perform any of these acts singly or in combination.

The Bonds are to be Revenue Bonds in the amount of \$300,000.00 to be paid solely from the revenues of the water district and are to mature over a period of 30 years. The vote shall be by ballot upon which shall be the words "Revenue Bonds" and "Revenue Bonds" and the voter shall place a cross (x) between the words "Revenue Bonds" and the word "YES", or between the words "Revenue Bonds" and the word "NO", whichever indicates his choice.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against said contract of said indebtedness will, on said day and date at the place aforesaid, be opened at the hour of 8:00 o'clock A.M., Pacific Standard Time, and remain open until the hour of 8:00 o'clock P.M., Pacific Standard Time, of the same day, at which hour the same shall be closed.

Damascus Shopping Center

DAMASCUS—New residents are flocking to the Damascus area at a brisk rate but, in the view of two Portland businessmen, they have had no proper shopping center to patronize.

That's now being taken care of by the businessmen, George M. Lopiparo and Louis M. Zimel, operating as the Damascus Development Co. The Damascus Thriftway

Shopping Center, now under construction on the south side of Oregon Hy. 212, should be ready for opening by the end of March, says LoPiparo, of the 15th Ave. Thriftway Store in Portland.

LoPiparo and Zimel, of Zimel Realty Co., have been planning the project 2½ years, and nearly a dozen enterprises have been signed for occupancy, LoPiparo said.

With Thriftway as the dominant store, other businesses will be a Ben Franklin variety store, Jeri's Dress Shop, Mr. D's Men's Shop, along with a drug store and pharmacy, health food store, sporting goods store, beauty shop and Martinizing cleaners.
