Joseph Hudon

Funeral services for Joseph Hudon were held Wednesday Feb. 7, in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home.

Joseph Earl Hudon was born on Oct. 11, 1898, in Oak Lake, Manitoba, Canada. His family lived in Canada until he was 2 years of age, when they moved to Seattle. Three years later they moved to Blynn, Wash. In 1913, Mr. Hudon returned to Canada where he later served in the Canadian Army.

Returning to Washington in 1917, he worked in the logging industry and as a surveyor for the government on the Yakima Indian Reservation. In 1921 he moved to Portland to work in the ship yards. He made his home at Brightwood in 1947 and on Jan. 2, 1948 he was married to Katherine Nelson in Gresham.

Mr. Hudon retired in 1964 due to a trucking accident. From the time he moved to Oregon in 1921 until 1960, Mr. Hudon enjoyed wholesaling Christmas trees.

Joseph Hudon died on Feb. 4, 1973 in a Portland hospital at the age of 74 years. He was preceded in death by his son, Joseph Hudon, Jr., during WWII.
