

Blues concert dated Non-smoker insurance rate drops

Sonny Black plays the blues at Mt. Hood Community College, Wednesday, Feb. 28 at noon in the student lounge.

A guitarist and singer since age 12, Black has been influenced by such blues musicians as T-Bone Walker, Muddy Waters, John Lee Hooker, B.B. King and Lightnin' Hopkins.

He's played with various bands in the Portland area,

beginning in 1967 with the original Portland Zoo band.

The Sonny Black Blues Band features Frank Reich on bass, Robert Broadhead on drums and Art Chaney, tenor-sax.

The group plays mostly blues and pop numbers from the 1930's and 40's.

Their performance at Mt. Hood will be open to the public and no admission will be charged.
