

Blue Marlins host Red Conference meet

Over 450 swimmers will be in the Sandy area this weekend. The event is the Red Conference swim championships.

The Sandy Blue Marlin Aquatic Club is hosting the event at the Sandy pool on Saturday and Sunday. The warmups will begin at 9 a.m. with events starting at 10 a.m. both days and running throughout the day.

Besides the swimmers, it is expected that between 300 to 400 spectators will view the two day swim meet.

Sandy swim director Jim Anstine with the help of the Blue Marlin parent club will be directing the meet.

A special feature of the meet

will be the special Centennial trophies which will be awarded to the best swimmer in each of the different age brackets.

Anstine feels his team has a good chance to take the conference title and invites all area residents to view the meet if possible.

The following is a short profile of each of the Sandy swimmers entered in the meet by Anstine.

Nancy Rohweder: Best strokes are breast-stroke, butterfly. She is a 2nd year swimmer, holds two team records.

Erica Neuenfeldt: Best strokes are backstroke and butterfly. Erica was most valuable swimmer, 8 & under

last season.

Joni Duff: Best strokes freestyle and butterfly. Joni was our most improved girls swimmer on last years team.

Gayle Roth: Best stroke backstroke. This is her 1st year on the team. She has three older brothers swimming on the team.

Lori Russell: Lori just turned nine and had successful year swimming as an 8 & under. We expect good things from Lori.

Susan Hartke: This is Susan's 1st year on the team. She is a strong swimmer and with experience should prove to be a very good swimmer.

Claudia Richards: This is her 2nd year. She has shown im-

provement in all strokes especially breast-stroke this year. Claudia is our top 10 & under breast-stroker.

Dawn O'Malley: Dawn is a new swimmer on the team. With only one month of experience, Dawn shows a lot of desire and good swimming strength.

Debbie Bowman: Debbie was having a very good season as a 10 & under earlier this year. She turned 11 at mid-season and now is competing against more experienced swimmers in the 11 & 12 bracket. Debbie's best stroke is breast-stroke and this is her 2nd year on the team.

Barbie King: Barbie is also at the bottom of her age group. Barbie is strong in all strokes. She has been on the team since she was 8 years old.

Karen Rohweder: Karen is our combination swimmer, diver, and synchronized swimmer. Karen shows a lot of strength and talent in all of aquatic events.

Leann Madison: Leann is another 11 year old that has improved tremendously. She has developed ear problems and had to drop swimming for a while. She should be back with us this summer and I anticipate a very successful season this summer for her.

Debbie Waibel: Debbie is also 11. Her best stroke is breast-stroke. She has been swimming competitively since she was 8.

Jeanne Duff: Jeanne is one of our leading 11 & 12 swimmers. She is a strong swimmer and holds records in the 8 & under division and one in the 10 & under division.

Nancy Marsh: Nancy is 11 years old and is our strongest 11 & 12 swimmer. She holds team records in butterfly in the 10 & under and in the 11 & 12. She is a consistently hard worker and good competition. Nancy has been swimming 4 years.

Brenda Reedy: This is Brenda's 1st year on the team. She is a strong swimmer and a hard worker. She has a lot of potential and has turned in good times as a 1st year swimmer.

Barbara Boothby: Barbara is one of our stronger more experienced swimmers. This is her 5th year in swimming. She swam in the 1st Red Conference meet held in Sandy in 1969.

Katie Neuenfeldt: Katie was the Blue Marlins most valuable swimmer for the 1971-72 season. She is one of our strongest swimmers and holds records in 8 & under freestyle, 11 & 12 butterfly and IM, 13 & 14 butterfly.

Nancy Perkins: Nancy has been swimming for 2 years. She is a very good competitive swimmer as well as being one of our best synchronized swimmers.

Linda Johnson: Linda is 13 and she has been swimming a little over 2 years. She does very well, particularly in the backstroke events.

Susan Workinger: Susan is in 8th grade, just finishing her 2nd year on the team. Her best strokes are breast-stroke and freestyle.

Virginia Hewgley: Virginia has shown a lot of improvement this past year. She is very smooth in the water and has good techniques.

Sarah Koepke: Sarah is also an 8th grader finishing her second year on the team. Her favorite stroke is breast-stroke.

Annelle Oldenberg: Nel is finishing her 3rd year on the team. She is very strong in the distance events and in butterfly. Nel Holds the high school record in the butterfly.

Jodie Perkins: Jodie is our girls team captain. She has been a member of the Blue Marlins for the past 4 years. She is a great leader and a hard worker.

Tina Smith: Tina has been swimming two years and is strong in the freestyle events.

Marcia Gynther: Marcia is one of the girls' team leaders. She was selected as the most improved swimmer off of last year's team.

Gretchen Lundeen: Gretchen is the captain of the girls team. She is a hard worker and her best events are freestyle distance events.

Joel Hartke: He is one of most improved swimmers this year. Joel, a first year swimmer, is 10 and does all strokes well, especially breast-stroke.

freestyle and breast-stroke. Bill Hewgley: A dedicated and hardworking swimmer, Bill was swimmer of the week recently.

Gary Roth: A strong competitor, Gary works hard to reach goals. Now 12, he holds the 10 and under butterfly record.

Barry Blair: A first year swimmer, he is 12 and enthusiastic. His best stroke is breast-stroke.

Mike Burghardt: This is his first year, and his best strokes are breast-stroke and freestyle.

Huie Hazelett: One of the most improved swimmers, he is in his first year. Huie is on the top swimmers in the 11-12 age group, and works extremely hard.

Dean Marsh: A dedicated swimmer, he has been in BMAC for three years. His best stroke is butterfly.

Don Marsh: In his first year, he has a good attitude about swimming. His best strokes are freestyle and butterfly.

Dan Rohweder: After a bout with illness, he is just getting in shape again. He is now turning in some of his best ever times.

Hank Hazelett: Another first year swimmer, he works hard, and has patience. All his strokes are good.

Tim Roberts: Though he has been on the team for only a month, he has learned all the competitive strokes and turns.

Nels Lundeen: He was Most Valuable swimmer last year in 11-12 age category. Now in 13-14 group, he is working hard to get competitive times.

Chris Roth: Very competitive, he strives to improve. He was a member of the Portland all star swim team, and was the BMAC's most improved swimmer last year.

Jim Russell: Now 13, he has been on the team over two years. He has good strength in all strokes.

Jeff Youngbluth: Jeff is a strong swimmer and is in his second year with his best events in freestyle.

Mike Edgar: Mike is one of the veterans on the team and has been a member of the high school team. His strong events are the butterfly, breast-stroke, freestyle and individual medley.

Gary Marsh: Gary was the most improved swimmer last year and is still improving this year.

As impressive as his statistics are for a freshman, Perkins' last five games have been better. In that span, Ray has scored at a 20 points per game clip from his forward position, and chipped in nearly ten rebounds a contest.

While at Sandy high, Perkins played under coach Jim Kitchen. He was named to the first team All Valley Division squad and received mention on All-League and All-State teams.

Bob Lewis, coach of the Judson Baptist basketball team, thinks that Perkins has the potential to become one of the Oregon Community College Athletic Association's finest forwards next year. Lewis cited Perkins' recent surge as a portent of even bigger things to come.

Buhler plays ball

Steve Buhler, a sophomore from Sandy, is a member of the 1972-73 Judson Baptist College basketball team. The 5'11" graduate of Sandy High School plays both forward and guard for coach Bob Lewis' Crusaders.

A starter last year as a freshman, Buhler had a good year, averaging 9.4 points per game. This season, his average was up over 10 before illness sidelined him for a number of games. Just getting back into form, Buhler is still the third leading point getter with an 8.4 clip. He is also third in assists.

An excellent driver, Buhler also has had great shooting nights from the outside. Against Chemeketa, he netted a season high 23 points.

While at Sandy, Buhler played basketball under coach Jim Kitchen.
