What's Cooking?

BAKED SAUSAGE AND BEAN CASSEROLE

1 lb pork sausage links
4 cups pork and beans
½ cup catsup
2 tablespoons prepared mustard

1 cup brown sugar
1 medium onion, sliced

Combine beans, catsup, mustard, brown sugar and onion and place in a well-greased casserole. Arrange pork sausage links on top of the beans and bake in moderate oven (350) for 40 to 50 minutes.

Serve with a tossed green salad and bread and you have a complete meal.

GREEN BEAN CASSEROLE

2 cans green beans, drained
1 can mushroom soup
1 teaspoon salt
1 teaspoon pepper
8 tablespoons soy sauce
1 can French fried onion rings.

Mix all ingredients except onion rings and bake in 350 degree oven for 20 minutes.

Sprinkle onion rings on top and cook 5 more minutes.—From the files of Mrs. Roy Hicks, Gadsden, Alabama.

PEACH CIDER
CHIFFON SALAD

6 peach halves, thoroughly drained

¼ teaspoon cinnamon
½ teaspoon ground cloves
1 (3-oz.) pkg. lemon flavored gelatin

1½ cups apple cider, heated

½ cup finely cut celery
¼ cup finely chopped nuts

Salad greens

Press well-drained peach halves, cut side down into wide-bottomed custard cups. Mix spices with gelatin in a bowl.

Add hot cider to spiced gelatin, stir until dissolved. Chill in freezing compartment of refrigerator until thick but not set, stirring occasionally. Beat with rotary beater until light and fluffy.

Fold in nuts and celery and divide mixture equally over peaches. Chill until firm.

Unmold on greens. Garnish center of peach as desired.

If you prefer you may congeal the salad in a long pan and cut in squares.—From the files of Mrs. Ruth L. Hicks, Gadsden, Alabama.
