## Drawings of birds makes rare display

Hairy Woodpecker, MacGillivray Warbler, Ruby-Crowned Kinglet, Pygmy Nuthatch and Sharp-Shinned Hawk are among 63 bird paintings on display in the Mt. Hood Community College library through April 8.

The watercolors are by Robert Bruce Horsfall and Zella M. Schultz.

Paintings show Pacific Northwest birds in their natural habitat—on beaches, in mountain pine trees, perched on weather-beaten fence posts, resting beneath lakeside brush or grouped on snowy fir boughs.

The MHCC exhibit introduces David B. Marshall's bird identification book, Familiar Birds of Northwest Forests, Fields and Gardens.

Some 133 birds, painted by Horsfall and Schultz, illustrate the guide book which goes on sale this month.

Marshall will be honored at a public reception Sunday, April 8, in the MHCC library from 2-5 p.m. A native Oregonian, Marshall works with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's endangered species program in Washington, D.C.

Mrs. Schultz will also attend the reception, along with members of Audubon Societies from Portland, Seattle, Salem, Medford and Eugene.

Horsfall was active with the Portland Audubon in the 1920's when his bird painting skills were recognized nationally.

He began painting as a youngster and "...fairly lived the lives of the animals I pictured, often watching for hours on end some insect, or helping some toad or spider get a dinner."

## Indian culture featured at college cultural week

A quiller, a weaver, an Indian poet and an Indian beader will take part in "Anishinabe Negaman" (Song of the People), a program to be held at Clackamas Community College April 2-6.

In addition to Indian craftsmen, the week-long event, sponsored by student government, the International Club and a minorities attitudes class, will feature a baked salmon dinner Wednesday night at 7 p.m., a series of films on the Indian and a presentation by Spencer Sahmaunt, scholarship officer for the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

A tepee and Indian smokehouse will also be set up for the cultural education program, according to Sandy Lofquist, chairman.

Percy One-Runner will demonstrate the use of porcupine quills in making head beading and necklaces on Monday (April 2) beginning at 11 a.m. in the Randall Hall Lobby.

## Women's Club to hold tea

The annual Library Tea, sponsored by the Sandy Women's Club, will be held Thursday, April 5, from 2 to 6 p.m. at the library.

Featured this year is an autograph party for the centennial publication, "Sandy Pioneers, Early Settlers, and Barlow Road Days." Many of the contributors to the book will be available to autograph copies of it, which will be on sale at the tea.

The book has been published in both hard and soft cover form. Those who ordered the hard cover edition may pick these up at that time.

Paintings from the Sandy Art Club will be on display at the library during the tea.

The library tea is open to the public, and those attending are urged to wear pioneer costumes if possible.

Susan Heise will exhibit weaving and Indian blanket making on Tuesday (April 3) beginning at 11 a.m. Ed Edmo, an Indian poet who has published a book of poetry, will give a presentation on Wednesday at 11 a.m. and Alex and Rose Currie, Indian bead makers, will exhibit and show Indian beading techniques on Thursday at 11 a.m.

"We are also attempting to locate an Indian silversmith for Wednesday's program," Mrs. Lofquist said.

A baked salmon dinner, open to the public, is scheduled for Wednesday night beginning at 7 p.m. Frank White Buffalo Man, grandson of Sitting Bull, will present Indian dancing and singing during the dinner. No charge will be made for the dinner, however, a donation will be requested to help cover costs.

Sahmaunt will present a one-half hour video tap program titled "Red Sun Rising" at 8 p.m., which explains tribal organization in Oregon. He will follow the taped presentation with a program on Indian education.

A series of films is also scheduled during the week Monday through Thursday at 11 a.m. and 7 p.m. in the McLoughlin Theatre. On Friday, five films will be shown beginning at noon.

The films include: "As Long As the River Shall Run," (Monday); "Ballad of Crowfoot," (Tuesday); "Treaties Made, Treaties Broken," (Wednesday); "How the West Was Won, Honor Lost," (Thursday); and "Lament of the Reservation" and a repeat of the four other films (Friday).

Information about the program is available from the college student government office, 656-2631, extension 259.

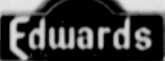
