The speaker will be Dr. James Coll, genetics fellow of the University of Oregon Medical school. Slasses in genealogy begin at 9:30 a.m.

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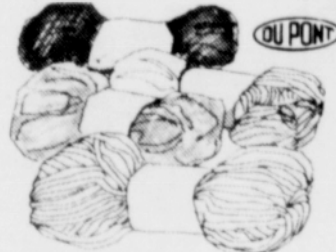
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
