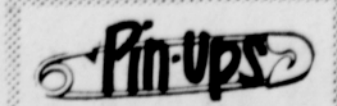

Church damaged

Vandals did an estimated \$200 damage to Rockwood Christian Church 17021 E. Burnside Saturday night, April 7, according to sheriff's reports.

Rocks were thrown through ten windows, the report states.

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Q. When a deceased person is entitled to both a Social Security and Veterans death benefit allowance, how is the distribution made?

A. The lump sum Social Security death benefit is paid to the veteran's widow without regard to funeral cost, if she was living with her husband. The \$250 Veterans funeral benefit usually is paid to the mortuary.

If there is no widow, or the widow was estranged from her husband, Social Security will pay as a death benefit only the difference between the Veterans allowance, and the cost of the funeral. The maximum payable under these circumstances may not exceed the Social Security entitlement; this ranges from \$165 to \$255.
