

Boy commended for fire rescue

John Pruitt, age 13, was commended by Pioneer Motel and Trailer Park owner Cal Rector, for his rescue efforts during a trailer fire there last week.

"The kid was able to get his sister out of the burning trailer and rescue many household belongings before the fire did too much damage," said Rector. "That was quick thinking for a boy his age."

John's sister, Sonya Cozad, age seven, was asleep in a bedroom at the time the fire

started, and he had dozed off in the living room while babysitting. When he was awakened by his dog, the fire was already in progress.

"I saw smoke, so I went outside, and got my sister out through the bedroom window," said John. "Next I got some furniture and stuff out, then called the fire department."

The fire, caused by an overheated oil furnace, did approximately \$3,000 worth of damage.

The parents of the children, Mr. and Mrs. J.R. Cozad were not home at the time of the fire. The family had just moved from Estacada, where John still attends school. Sonya attends Sandy Grade School.

Chicken 'N Honey

1 fryer, cut-up, or breasts, thighs and legs
1/4 cup flour
1/2 tsp salt
1/4 tsp. pepper
1/4 cup oil
4-5 large fresh mushrooms, sliced
1 can small onions, drained
1 Tbs. honey
1/2 cup white wine

Dredge chicken in flour seasoned with salt and pepper. Heat oil in a skillet and brown lightly on both sides. Remove to a shallow casserole. To the skillet, add mushrooms, onions, and 1 tsp. flour. Stir with wooden spoon. Add the honey and wine and stir until bubbly. Pour over the chicken and bake, uncovered, for 45 minutes to 1 hour at 350°
