

Baseballers win;Grockett, Peterson lead track wins

The Sandy high track and baseball teams picked up wins this week and have several events set for this week.

The track team kept its perfect duel meet season in tack with a 74-71 win over Canby and a 95-49 win over Molalla.

The Canby team came into the meet right behind the Pioneers in division standings, but the overall depth of the Pioneers proved too much.

Ralph Peterson led the way taking first in two events for Sandy. He won the long jump, and the 330 hurdles in the Canby meet.

Other winners for Sandy were the 440 relay team; Jackson 100; Grockett 440; Whisner 880; M. Peterson 220; and McVicker, javelin.

This was an important win

for the Pioneers coached by Ed Hug.

In the win over Molalla, the Pioneers got great efforts from R. Peterson and Gregg Grockett.

Peterson was his usual self collecting three first places, but in winning the jumps he was outstanding. His leap of 21 ft. 2 inches in the long jump and 42 ft. 6 3/4 inches in the triple jump are in the top bracket for state competition.

He also won the 330 hurdles with good time of 41.9.

Grockett meanwhile, turned in one of the top five best marks in the state in his specialty the 880. Grockett turned the track twice in the time of 1:58.4.

The other winners for Sandy were the 440 relay team; Doug Blaisdell mile; mile relay team; Mike Whisner two mile; Joe Davenport high hurdles;

and John McVicker, javelin.

Coach Hug now will get his team ready for action in the upcoming district meets.

In baseball, the Pioneers have won three straight moving their division record to 5-4.

The last two wins were over Sweet Home and Estacada and Friday the team will host

Silverton.

Against Estacada, the team scored four runs in the second, one in the sixth and ended the game with a three run rally in the seventh. The final score was 8 to 5.

Winning pitcher for Sandy was Wayne Stone. He went the distance to collect the win.

Vickie Cook scored 5 runs, and Cindy Wilds and Shannon Ellis each scored 4 runs to lead the girls' efforts.

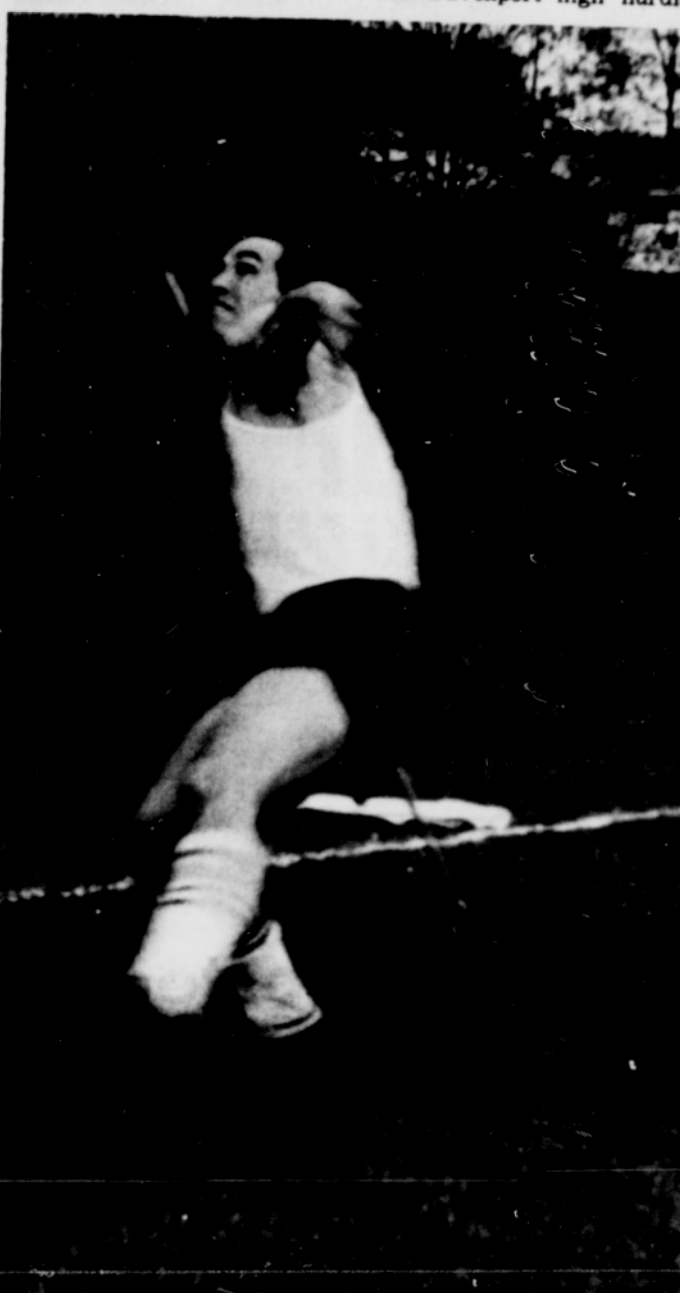
Shannon Ellis was the winning pitcher.
