County Baha's hold ceremony at Wemme

On May 23, Baha'is around the world observed the Declaration of the Bab and the 130th Anniversary of the birth of the Baha'i faith.

The Baha'is of Clackamas County commemorated the Baha'i Holy Day on the evening of May 22, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Herb Dreyer in Wemme, with readings from Baha'i scriptures.

On May 23, 1844 in Shiraz, Iran (then Persia) a young man, known as the Bab (Gate), announced His Mission as a Prophet of God and as heralding the beginning of a new universal cycle and a new age for mankind. He also asserted that the coming of a greater Prophet from God was at hand and whose coming would fulfill the prophecies of all great religions.

Because of His teachings, the Bab and His followers were persecuted by the Muslim clergy. These persecutions persisted during His imprisonment and banishment and culminated in His public martyrdom in 1850 at Tabriz, Iran. Some 20,000 of His followers were also martyred during the early history of the Faith.

The promised one foretold by the Bab was Baha'u'llah, Founder of the Baha'i Faith. Baha'u'llah's name means "The Glory of God."

Since 1844, the Baha'i Faith has spread to over 333 countries and territories. Baha'is believe that all religions come from the same Divine Source and that all are a progressive unfoldment of God's Word for man. Baha'u'llah, they believe, is the

latest but not the last of God's Messengers and that His teachings are the Divine remedy for the problems of this Age.

May 23 was also the birthday of 'Abdu'l-Baha, the eldest son of Baha'u'llah. He was born on May 23, 1844, the day the Baha'i Faith began. He shared persecution, exile, and imprisonment with his Prophet-Father.

Baha'is have been residing in the Clackamas County area for over 10 years. The first Local Spiritual Assembly of the county, an administrative body of nine members, was formed in Clackamas County in March of this year. The Clackamas County Baha'i Community includes all Baha'is residing in the county, but not within the limits of an incorporated city.
