Building permits increase

Building permits were up in Clackamas County in April, 1973, compared to April, 1972, the University of Oregon Bureau of Business and Economic Research has reported.

In April, 1973, the total was \$4,783,369 compared to \$4,233,650 in the same month last year.

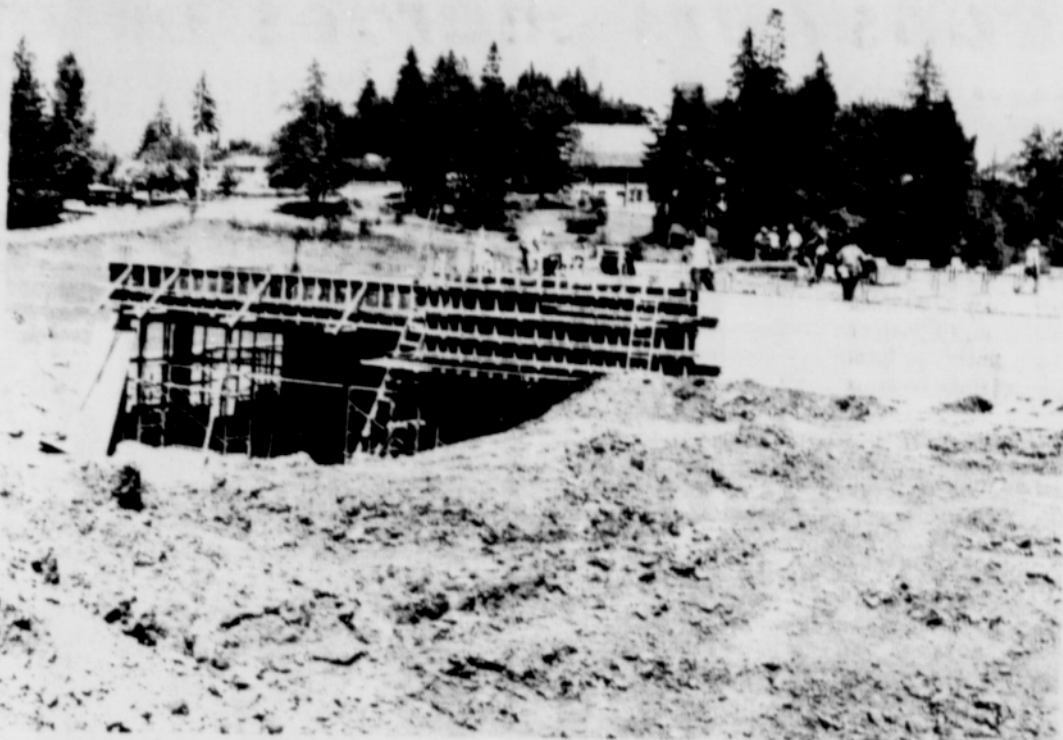
Building permits from 148 identical reporting centers in Oregon totaled \$88,724,242 in April, 1973. This was 64.8 per cent higher than in April 1972. The state total in April, 1973, included \$40,351,359 for 2335 new nonresidential construction and \$6,927,027 for additions, alterations, and repairs to existing structures.

For the same month last year, the \$53,850,215 total of permits was composed of \$33,939,949 for 2218 new dwelling units, \$12,356,860 for new nonresidential construction, and \$7,553,406 for additions, alterations, and repairs to existing structures.

Land sale hits snag

Funeral services were May 29 at San Jose.

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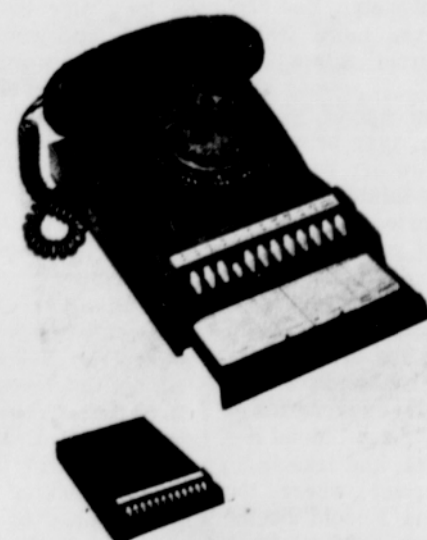
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
