Elmo C. Petteys, a Sandy resident since 1963 died in a McMinnville nursing home on June 18 at the age of 75 years.

Elmo Chester Petteys was born in Blue Hill, Neb., on Apr. 8, 1898. Mr. Petteys was raised in Nebraska where he received his education.

In 1916, he was married to Gladys Pearl Shill. They made their home in Nebraska where he worked as a meat cutter. In 1950, Mr. Petteys moved to Arizona where he operated a second hand store until 1963 when he moved to Sandy to retire.

Survivors include his children Macine Miller, Amity; Adaline Miller, Portland; Harvey Zimeral, Portland; and Bud Zimeral, Vancouver; 1 sister, Nellie Bothy, Nebraska; 10 grandchildren and 18 great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were held Thursday, June 21, in the chapel of Sandy Funeral Home. Burial was at the Scandinavian Cemetery in Sandy.

Pioneer reunion

A family reunion was held for descendants of the Wesley and Jesse Bacon family, Sunday, May 20, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Vistor Bacon in Madras.
