Other activities included social and athletic events such as donkey basketball, a track meet, parties and dances.

Visitor count up in state

Visitors to Oregon's border information centers were up 10.6 per cent over May of last year, the Oregon State Highway Division reported today. Out-of-state visitors to the Capitol Visitor Center were up about 1.5 per cent.

The information centers at Portland, Klamath Falls and Ashland each showed approximately a 15 per cent increase in the number of visitors

requesting information on travel in Oregon, according to Victor B. Fryer, travel information director for the Highway Division. The only center to show a drop was Astoria with a 9.4 per cent decrease in the number of visitors.

In addition to these centers, the ones at Ontario and Brookings were beginning their first full season and recorded a busy month. Ontario showed 3,192 visitors which was just short of Portland's 3,428. The Siskiyou Center, south of Ashland, is the state's oldest and busiest center. It registered 7,809 visitors during the month.

Cause of the decrease at Astoria is not definite but information center employees suspect that adverse weather during the last few days of the month made the difference. Up to that time, visitations were equal to last year's count.

At the Capitol, visitations by out-of-state tourists were up with 931 for this year compared to 908 for May of last year. Capitol Guide Supervisor Frances Bell said she felt that the difficulty of parking because of the legislative session may have kept some visitors away.

But it didn't keep Oregonians away. Being "where the action is" attracted 8,907 Oregon visitors during the month as compared to 5,629 last year. A great many of these visitors were members of school classes who came to see the legislature in session.
