

Roger Yamashita wins three scholarships

July 4 picnic

Roger Yamashita is in the winners circle again. The 18-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. George Yamashita has received the statewide 4-H scholarship for \$400 presented by Standard Oil Co. The grant was based on both school and 4-H records.

Yamashita, who will study architecture at University of Oregon, also received two other awards at Barlow High School

National 4-H Conference in April. Yamashita said the weeklong session in Washington, D.C. was work oriented.

"We were to make recommendations on ways to improve 4-H," he said. "One area in which I worked was the creative use of spare time. We decided it might be good to form more clubs related to recreation—like hiking or bicycling."

The member of Harambee, Multnomah County's teen service club, also cited the need to integrate service projects into individual club work.

He thinks there's great emphasis on improving the 4-H program as it spreads to the city.

"I think the 4-H program is spreading out rather than changing from strictly rural to strictly urban," he said. "The 4-H clubs are encompassing

more."

Although some projects seem to be moving toward more technical orientation, Yamashita said the "Learn by Doing" motto is still of major importance.

"Kids get tired of reading from a book—it's not the same as having the experience," he believes. "They get tired of sitting and listening how to do it and want to get out there and try. I think that's why schools

are turning toward vocational and technical programs."

Although not everyone can win the championship, the competitive aspects of 4-H are a good thing, according to Yamashita.

"Everybody gets something," he said. "You compete against a set standard. The 4-H program provides competition and rewards everybody for trying."

Yamashita, who was named

Barlow Boy of the Year plus receiving the Junior Citizenship Award from the Japanese-American Citizens League, said he plans to continue in 4-H. This is his ninth year in the youth organization.

"My goal is a 10 year pin," he smiled.

In the meantime he is going to Hawaii with another former Barlow student, Jeff Hardin, to pick pineapples to earn college money.

Rockwood lunch cost

The first price increase for school lunches since 1967 will go into effect in September as a result of board action at the June 11 meeting of the Rockwood School Board.

Because of continued increases in the cost of food and labor, student lunches will go from 30 cents to 35 cents while adult lunches will go from 50 cents to 60 cents when school resumes in September.

Other business brought before the board included approval of the new social studies texts; approval of summer curriculum workshops in social studies, language arts, and science; approval for a district employee to attend the International Symposium on Learning Disabilities, Oct. 29-Nov. 2, in San Diego, Calif. and authorization given to select an architect for the study of Rockwood School.

The resignation of Mrs. Audrey Bloodgood was accepted.

The ranunculus is most popular in the South. The flower, large and full, is easy to grow just about anywhere.

The plant is started from claw-shaped roots which are very hard and dry. These are planted claw downwards, two inches deep and two inches apart. You may or may not dig up the roots to replant them.

Whatever you do, you will find the ranunculus a rewarding addition to any garden with a breath of color and fragrance which must be seen to be really admired.
