WHAT'S COOKING?

Now that meat is such a major item in the food budget everyone is looking for good recipes for the cheaper cuts. Here are some ideas.

BAJA BURGERS

1 lb. lean ground beef
1/2 cup crushed corn chips
Salt
Pepper
1 can (8 oz.) tomato sauce with onions
1/4 teaspoon garlic salt
1/4 teaspoon chili powder
4 French rolls, split and toasted

1/4 cup sliced stuffed olives
1/4 cup shredded cheddar cheese
Mix beef and corn chips; shape into four oblong patties to fit French rolls. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Cook in skillet turning once, about 8-10 minutes. Combine tomato sauce with onions, garlic salt and chili powder; add to skillet and simmer a few minutes to blend flavors. Place burgers on bottom halves of rolls and top with sauce, olives and cheese. Cover with roll tops. Makes 4 servings—From the files of Mrs. William Kelly, San Diego.

MEAT-ZA-PIE

1 lb. ground beef
2-3 cup evaporated milk (small can)
1/2 cup fine bread crumbs
1 teaspoon garlic salt
1/2 cup tomato paste or catsup
2 small cans mushrooms
1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
1/4 teaspoon oregano
2 Tablespoons Parmesan cheese
Mix meat with milk, crumbs and garlic salt with fork. Pat mixture evenly on bottom and sides of 2 (8" or 9") pan, pull it over top. Spread tomato paste over meat, drain mushrooms and cover paste. Top with

shredded cheese, sprinkle with oregano. Add Parmesan cheese. Bake 24 minutes at 370 degrees. Serves 4—From the files of Mignon Smith, Monterey, Calif.

RIPE OLIVE STROGANOFF

1 cup ripe olives
1/2 cup chopped onions
1 clove minced garlic
1/4 cup butter or margarine
1 lb ground beef
2 Tablespoons flour
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 (4 oz.) can mushrooms
1 (10 oz.) can cream of

chicken soup
1 cup sour cream
2 Tablespoons minced parsley

Cut olives into good sized pieces. Cook onion and garlic in butter until soft. Add meat and cook until lightly browned. Blend in flour, salt, pepper, mushrooms and liquor, and soup. Simmer until meat is done, about 15-20 minutes. Blend in sour cream and bring to a boil. Add parsley and olives. Serve with noodles or rice. The LWML, an auxiliary organization of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, has 5,995 local societies with almost 200,000 members in the United States and Canada.

The entire assembly will consider the question, "What would God have me do?" as it divides into action groups.

Multi-media presentations will alert participants to problems encountered in facing retirement, coping with death and grief, working with the underprivileged and prisoners and in human relationships.

New concepts of evangelism, Bible study and prayer will be explored.

The convention will open with a 7:30 p.m. communion service in the Mobile Municipal Auditorium. The speaker will be the Rev. Charles Mueller, president of the Southeastern district of the LC-MS.

A. If you are the unmarried widow of an eligible veteran who died either in service or as a result of an injury or disease incurred in service, you are entitled to a G.I. Loan. Your loan eligibility is distinct from that of your deceased husband; any benefit he may have used in no way affects the benefit available to you.

For you to be eligible, your husband must have served during certain periods. Check with us about those dates.
