Sandy swimmers who made triple "A" times were: Gayle Roth (8 and under) who received certificates for 50 yard freestyle, 25 yard backstroke, and 25 yard butterfly; Gary Marsh (15-17) received a triple "A" certificate for 100 yard freestyle.

Blue Marlins who took first places were: Nancy Marsh (11-12) 100 yard freestyle; Linda Johnson (13-14) 100 yard backstroke; Carl Neuenfeldt (15-17) 100 yard backstroke; Gary Marsh (15-17) 100 yard butterfly; and Steve Roth (15-17) 100 yard freestyle and 100 yard backstroke.

The next activities on the Blue Marlin schedule are a duet meet with Oregon City on Wednesday, June 20, and a weekend duet-meet with the River Road Swim Club in Eugene on June 23-24.

Sandy Legion team wins, loses on home run hits

The Sandy American Legion baseball team won one game and dropped one last week to sport a 5-2 record. This record places the team near the top of the league standings.

The Sandy team beat Taylor Electric 6 to 5 in extra innings and lost 1-0 to Oregon City.

Sandy came up with two runs in the seventh to tie the electric team at 5-5 and force the extra innings. The winning run came in the ninth on a home run by Dan Turin.

Mark Baughman pitched for the Pioneers collecting six strikeouts and allowing only

nine hits.

Meanwhile, his teammates led by Turin's three hits and three rbi's, got the opposing pitcher for 10 hits.

Turin got a single and a triple before blasting his home run shot in the ninth.

Jay Dodson and Wayne Stone both also hit with power each collecting a single and triple. Both also knocked in a run.

Baughman got a double as did Dean Dickinson, while Larry Dahrens hit a single for the other Sandy hits.

The Electric team scored three in the first, one in the third and one in the seventh. Sandy scored two in the third, one in the sixth, two in the seventh and the winning run in the ninth.

Baughman again pitched for Sandy in the loss to Oregon City 1-0.

400 4-H'ers head for camp Colton

Over 400 Clackamas County 4-H'ers will attend 4-H Camp at Colton this month, according to T.D. Zurcher, Extension Agent, 4-H. Dates for camp are June 11-16 and 18-23.

Crafts, camp fires, swimming hiking, athletics, and many other activities have been planned by the 4-H Camp committee headed by Mrs. Miriam Beasley, Oregon City.

Over 50 resource people from industry, Fish and Game Commission, Extension Service, and 4-H have volunteered their time and talents. The two one-week sessions at Camp Colton comprise the largest 4-H county camping program in the state, added Zurcher.

The opportunity for almost one out of four county 4-H'ers from 9-12 years old to attend 4-H Camp is made possible through excellent support within each community of the county, explained Zurcher. 4-H Community Coordinators in each grade school area award the campships on the basis of the 4-H records of the individuals.

This year's activities include "learn by doing" sessions in archery, collagues, fire building, fly tying, nature prints, woodlore, leathercraft, wildlife, bug cages, bow making and outdoor cookery.

In addition to several resource people, the staff will include 25 high school counselors for each week. These older 4-H'ers will be responsible for ten or eleven youngsters throughout the week. The opportunity to be a counselor is one of the more sought-after positions for older 4-H'ers. This year over 800 applied for the positions.

The lone run came in the last of the seventh with two down when the visitors got their fourth hit of the game, a home run.

Baughman had shut out the Oregon City team on three hits up until Crisp hit his round-tripper.

Meanwhile, Sandy was able only to get to the Oregon City pitcher for two hits in the game.

Randy Moody hit a double in the first and Baughman hit a single in the sixth.
