### Builders register

The State Builders Board has contracted with special investigators to contact builders throughout the state to determine compliance with the provisions of the Homebuilders Law which was effective July 1, 1972.

The law provides that all those who bid or perform work in connection with residential structures must be registered with the Builders Board to protect their right to court suit to collect compensation for that work and to avoid penalty for violation of the law.

Information relative to nearly 8000 registered builders is available from local building officials, Department of Commerce district offices and from the Builders Board office in Salem.

Graff will be appearing as Hortensio in the Cole Porter play.

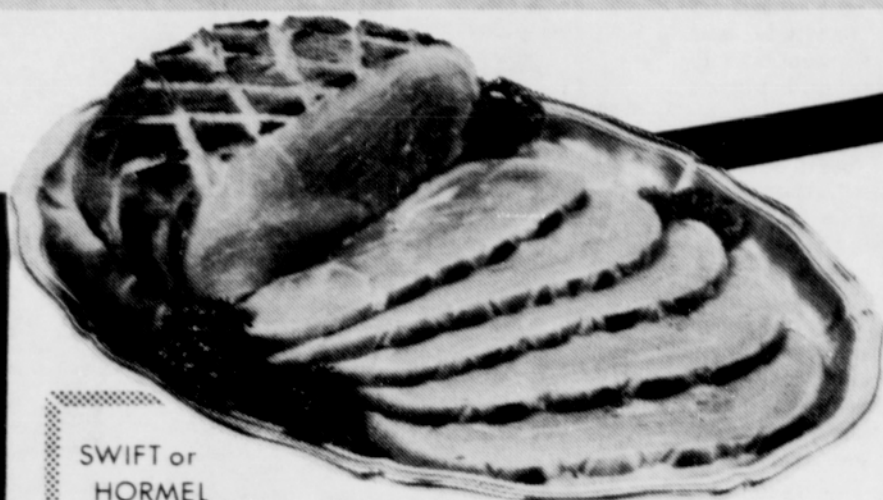
The first performance, on Thursday, June 28 at 8 p.m., will be for the benefit of the

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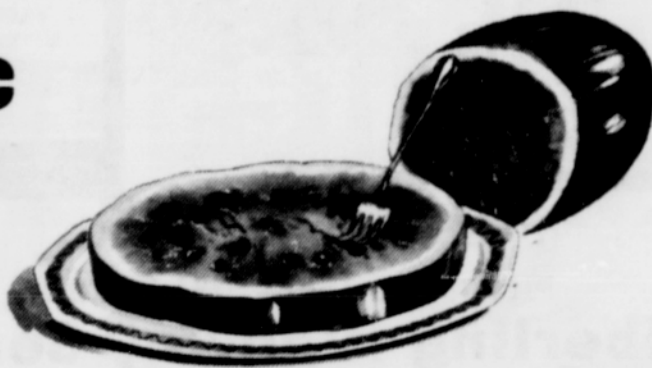
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
