Sandy youth held in beating

A 15-year-old Sandy youth is being held in the beating of an 82-year-old Oregon City man. Clackamas County authorities arrested the juvenile Thursday afternoon. He had reportedly escaped from a room at the county juvenile center shortly before noon on Thursday and accosted the man in an effort to obtain money, a gun and a car during his escape. Frank Schrupp, a resident of an Oregon City nursing home, was the victim of the beating. He is in the intensive care unit of the Willamette Falls Hospital. He suffered facial and hand lacerations in the assault on a secluded gravel lane. The youth, who reportedly had been involved in a series of

armed robberies and burglaries in Clackamas and Multnomah counties, escaped while being administered psychiatric tests at the juvenile center. Counselors at the center discovered Schrupp while searching for the escaped youth. Schrupp reportedly told them he had been accosted by a boy who demanded he be provided with money, a gun and a car. Schrupp said he told the youth he would cooperate, but did not own a car. His assailant then assaulted him and left him lying in the narrow roadway, authorities reported. The youth was located in a Milwaukie home about 6:30 p.m. and taken into custody by a Clackamas County deputy and a juvenile officer.
