4-H clubs slate geology camp

Clackamas county 4-H members, their families and leaders are planning to participate in the 1973 Oregon 4-H Geology camp July 13-15 at Tumalo State Park near Bend, reports T. D. Zurcher, Clackamas county extension agent.

The camp will open with a campfire program Friday evening, July 13, featuring a slide show to introduce participants to the geology of the area. Saturday, the young geologists will tour the area, with stops planned at the Metolius river springs, Cova Palisades, Round Butte Dam, and Smith Rocks.

Sunday, the young people are scheduled to visit Lava Butte, Lava Cast Forest, and Paulina Peak following a short church service on Pilot Butte, Zurcher said.

The weekend will include time for 4-H geology members to do some collecting of rocks and minerals and to trade specimens with others at-

tending, according to Cal Monroe, Oregon State University assistant state 4-H leader.

Assisting with the camp and tour will be Phil Brogan, well-known Bend geologist and writer; Mel Washwell, Metolius, Central Oregon teacher, and Larry Brown, Albany, from the U.S. Bureau of Mines.

This is the eighth year of the geology camp program, Monroe notes, and he expects the largest attendance ever, reflecting an increase in enrollment in the 4-H geology project. This year, nearly 670 young people are involved in the 4-H project, the highest number ever for the natural science program.

Monroe notes that Central Oregon is an ideal setting for this type of activity because the county is open and the geologic features are easy to see and to reach.

Those attending the camp are responsible for their own

transportation, food and camping equipment, Zurcher adds. Additional information may be obtained from the Clackamas county extension office in Oregon City.
