Q. Is it true that old insurance policies may actually still have value even though their premiums have not been paid for many years?

A. This is very possibly true. Life insurance policies should never be discarded or destroyed until they have been thoroughly checked for their extended insurance value. With the exception of group and term insurance almost all insurance contracts have a cash value after they have been in effect for a stipulated number of years. When premiums on these policies are not paid as they become due this cash value is used to pay the premiums and keep the policy in force for a specific period of time.

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
