

Flood damage study made

The Portland District, Corps of Engineers, is conducting a survey of commercial and industrial businesses to help determine potential flood damages along the Willamette River and its tributaries, according to Colonel Clarence D. Gilkey, District Engineer.

He said the Corps is attempting to determine damages that would be caused by large floods along the Willamette River. The data collected in the survey will be used to assess public needs for flood control.

Colonel Gilkey asked for the cooperation of local businesses in answering the survey, noting that no data will be published on an individual firm basis.

The survey is being conducted by two consulting firms: Cornell, Howland, Hayes and Merryfield, Inc. and General Appraisal Company.
