The Sandy American Legion baseball team improved its season record to 13-6 with three wins during the past week. The local nine beat David

Douglas 7-2, Columbia Fence (Centennial) 13-3 and Marx and Chase 7-6.

Strong hitting was the key to the three Sandy wins. The team

collected a total of 27 hits in the three games.

In the win over DD, the Pioneers scored all their runs in two innings. Sandy scored three in the fourth to overcome a two run DD lead and then scored four in the sixth to put the game out of reach.

Wayne Stone went the distance on the mound for Sandy collecting six strikeouts on route to the win. He allowed only two hits.

Big hitters for Sandy were Larry Dahrens and Randy Moody. Dahrens hit a triple and drove in two runs while Moody with his single also knocked in two runs.

Dan Turin and Jay Dodson both got two singles and knocked in a run, while Mike Wecker collected a single and drove in a run.

In the win over Columbia Fence, the Pioneers pounded the opposing pitchers for all but one of their runs in the final three innings.

Sandy scored two in the fifth, five in the sixth and six in the final frame to win going away 13-3.

The other Sandy run was

scored in the first inning after Columbia Fence had jumped off to a 1-0 lead in its half of the first.

Mark Baughman was the winning Sandy pitcher and he was backed by a nine hit Sandy attack.

Mike Pullen did a large portion of the damage to the Centennial team by driving in four runs with a single and double.

Dean Dickinson was the only other Sandy batter to collect more than one hit, he got two singles.

Other singles were hit by Wecker, Turin, Dodson, Keith Jensen, and Baughman.

Collecting the other rbi's for the local nine were Wecker, Turin, Jensen, Moody and

Stone. Sandy had to go extra innings to pull out the win over Marx and Chase with Dodson stroking a single to drive in Turin with the winning run.

The Pioneers had held a 6-1 lead going into the final inning, but M&C came up with five runs to tie the game and force the extra innings.

Dodson got the winning hit in the ninth inning.

Turin and Jensen with three hits each led the Sandy batters. Turin and pitcher Baughman each drove in two runs to lead the Pioneers.

Other hitters for Sandy were Baughman, Wecker, Pullen, Dickinson and Dodson.

Jensen also got credit for an rbi.

Gold prices on increase

Record prices for gold on the world market have created a new "land office business" for the Bureau of Land Management, according to Archie D. Craft, state director for Oregon.

"During the past few weeks we have received a steady increase in the number of

requests for information about where and how to locate gold mining claims," said Craft. BLM administers the mining laws on more than 15 million acres of national resource land and nine million acres of national forest land in Oregon.

"The known gold producing areas in the state have been

covered by mining claims for many years," Craft added, "but the recent price jump has brought a new interest from individuals hoping to "strike it rich."

Under the Mining Law of 1872, a citizen may locate any number of mining claims on the public lands. Each claim must have an actual discovery of mineral and may be 20 acres. The filing of the claim allows a person to develop and extract the minerals. It confers no other rights.

A claimant cannot build a summer home or business, remove timber, or graze livestock on a claim. BLM will continue to manage the land surface on any new claims.

Mining claims are recorded in the county seat of the county in which they are located and not with the Bureau of Land Management.

Mini nationals drag races set

The Northwest's biggest drag race, the Mini Nationals, will be held at the Woodburn Drag Strip, Sunday, July 22. Sponsored by the Multnomah Hot

Rod Council, this year's event will be the largest "Pro Stock" meet ever held in the Pacific Northwest.

Following the theme of "Races For Everybody", the meet will also include full competition, modified, and super stock classes. There will be a total of \$8,000 in prize money, the largest purse of any race held this year.

Leading Pro Stock drivers from all over the country will be participating in the action-packed one day event. Bill Bagshaw, of Los Angeles, will bring his 1971 Dodge Challenger into the top eight-car field in the afternoon's feature race. Bagshaw's "Red Light Bandit" Pro Stocker has been clocked a quick 9.85 E.T. at 140 miles per hour.

A local feature in the Mini Nationals will be Don McLavey of Salem, Oregon and his Pro Stock Plymouth Duster. The McLavey car is the fastest pro stock car in the NHRA Northwest Division. This "Screamin'" Plymouth is powered by a 426 cubic inch Hemi.

The Mini Nationals will be one of the West's biggest drag events of the year. Gates will open at 8 a.m. with time trials, with eliminations starting at 1 p.m. Woodburn Drag Strip is 1 mile west of Interstate 5 at the Woodburn exit.
