Q. What are "death taxes"?
A. Inheritance, succession, transfer and estate taxes as well as any other taxes levied against the estate of a deceased person are known as "death taxes."
The liability for the payment of these taxes rests with the estate of the decedent. Under the state inheritance tax and the federal estate tax laws, those who succeed to the ownership of property subject to these taxes must satisfy any tax liability involved with property.
Under certain circumstances, funeral costs are deductible from "death taxes." In computing the taxable value of an estate transferred by will or interstate laws the cost of the funeral and interment expenses are entirely deductible. The cost of a cemetery monument is deductible. The cost of a cemetery monument is deductible within certain limitations. Funeral costs are not usually deductible from jointly held property.

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
