

City meets delays in Proctor Ave. work, park development

garden club officials, the dirt is not good for growing plants. "The contract we had with the state called for top soil to be placed in the planting areas," said Carl Hatfield, Jr. city administrator. "Anyone can see that we did not get the top soil, but rather a low grade of dirt and clay."

The city is now in the process of searching for a landscape architect to come in and upgrade the soil.

Following a meeting with Chamber of Commerce and garden club officials and the

county extension agent, it was determined the best route was to upgrade the soil rather than having it removed and new soil brought in," said Hatfield. He also indicated the funds for paying for this new project would be withheld from the Proctor Ave. improvement project contract.

"That is what I will recommend to the city council," said Hatfield.

It is hoped the soil can be upgraded and ready for plants by Sept. 15.

In other city news, the council is still waiting for matching funds from the Bureau of Outdoor Parks before starting to work on the city park.

The city park is on nine acres located directly behind the city hall.

It is estimated the total cost of the park development will be around \$30,000, according to Hatfield.

The city currently has allocated \$5,000 to be matched

by a similar amount from the Bureau of Parks. But until this additional \$5,000 comes, no work will be done on the park.

The first phase of development will include the installation of restrooms, electrical wiring, water lines, signs and some path improvements.

according to Hatfield. The park will be developed in three phases, eventually ending with several small group areas, large group areas and natural areas with paths for natural walks.

No date has been set for the completion of the park.
