Another special award winner was Nicky Redmond, who was the "Youngest" participant at 1½ years.

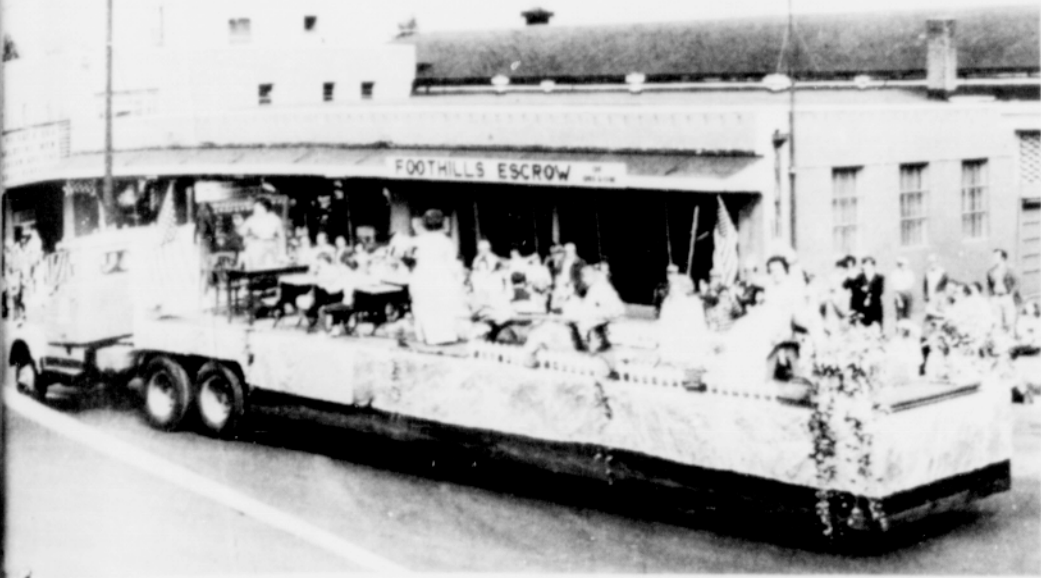
On the other hand, Pioneer Association King John Mitchell at 82 was the "Oldest" participant.
