buildings could be ready for use would be next school year. The total project, no matter which plan, is expected to take two years to complete construction, according to DeMarsh.

Several members of the audience questioned DeMarsh and the board on the need for a junior high system. Those who spoke felt by constructing the new wing on the 19 acres the district would have a good start towards the development of either a junior high building or a junior-senior building complex.

DeMarsh stated the district did not have

such plans, because unification would have to come first if a junior high system was to be developed.

Presently there are five different grade school districts feeding into Sandy High district.

Through either of the two expansion projects, the district facilities will be expanded to handle 1,200 students, according to DeMarsh.

Currently the district has close to 1,000 students and the current facilities are made for about 850 capacity.

DeMarsh stated the earliest the district could have a vote on the building issue would be Sept. 24.

Meanwhile, last week the committee met and resolved Hall and his staff of several more complaints under study of the review committee.

The new allegations will now be included in the review by the committee as it heads for completion of the review within the next 10 weeks.

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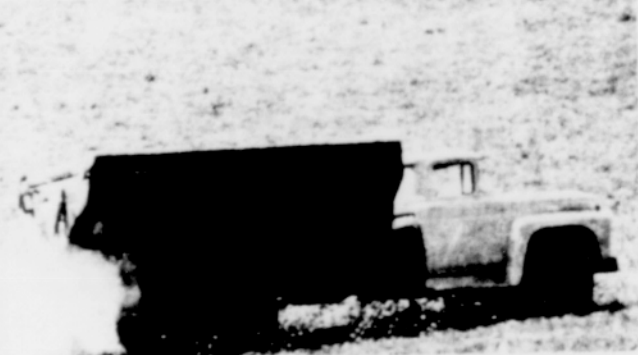

Entry was gained by the thief in the front door, reports.

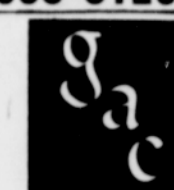
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
