4-H display at state fair honors Pacific Rim nations

International programs conducted by the Oregon State University Extension Service, particularly those concerning Pacific Rim nations, are being spotlighted in the 4-H building at the 1973 Oregon State Fair.

The exhibits are in keeping with the theme of the fair, "Gateway to the Orient," points out Mrs. Lynne Breese, OSU state extension agent.

The theme exhibit in the center of the building features costumes from Japan, The Philippines, Korea and Vietnam, along with other articles representing those and other nations. The theme exhibit is surrounded by international foods made by Oregon 4-H members as part of the 4-H foods and nutrition project, she notes.

Also being featured are continuous showings of slides taken by Oregonians who have participated in the International 4-H Youth Ex-

change (IFYE) program.

Slides from Japan, Korea, The Philippines, Taiwan, Jordan, Finland, Australia, Jamaica, Turkey, Israel, Sweden, Costa Rica, Nepal, India, New Zealand and Kenya are included in the display which was arranged by IFYE alumni.

Flags from Pacific Rim nations have been placed around the building. The national emblems were borrowed from the collection of the OSU Memorial Union.

Other exhibits include a display based on the recent 4-H Labo exchange between Oregon 4-H members and Japanese teen-agers studying English. This year Oregon families in eight counties hosted 82 Japanese youngsters and 12 adults. Part of this exhibit will be a sembazuru, or chain of a 1,000 cranes, made by youngsters in the Labo program in Japan to wish

Oregon 4-H good luck, Mrs. Breese explains. Each crane is made of paper.

In addition, other examples of origami, Japanese paper folding, will be on display around the building.

There will be an Oriental theme, featuring cherry blossoms and Japanese-style bridge, for the three 4-H style shows this year. The style revues are scheduled for 1:30 p.m. Sunday, Aug. 29; Thursday, Aug. 30, and Saturday, Sept. 1. All will be held in the youth auditorium of the 4-H building.
