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July log exports down

A total of 188.4 million board feet of softwood logs, Scribner scale, was exported from all ownerships in Washington, Oregon, northern California, and Alaska in July 1973.

The July volume was down 38.3 per cent from June 1973 exports and down 11.8 per cent from the July 1972 total, according to research economist David Darr of the U.S. Forest Service, Pacific Northwest Forest and Range Experiment Station in Portland.

Some 178 million board feet, or 94.5 per cent of the July 1973 west coast log exports, went to

Japan. July exports from Washington and Oregon totaled 177.6 million board feet, down 39.6 per cent from the June volume. Shipments from northern California totaled 7.1 million board feet, 19.5 per cent less than the June volume. Alaska exported a total of 3.7 million board feet in July compared with 217 million board feet in June.

Douglas-fir accounted for 27.5 per cent of July exports. Other softwoods, primarily western hemlock and true firs, made up the remaining 72.5 per

cent. July shipments had a total value of \$51.4 million at port of exportation and an average value of \$272.76 per thousand board feet, down from the record high average value of \$282.58 in June. Douglas-fir averaged \$277.38 per thousand board feet and other softwoods, \$271.

Export of softwood logs from the west coast totaled 1.8 billion board feet through the first 7 months of 1973, 20.6 per cent more than for the same period of 1972.

date. People who apply for a motorcycle endorsement on or after Oct. 5 will pay a new fee. They will pay a one-time \$3.50 fee to have a regular driver's license endorsed to operate motorcycles.

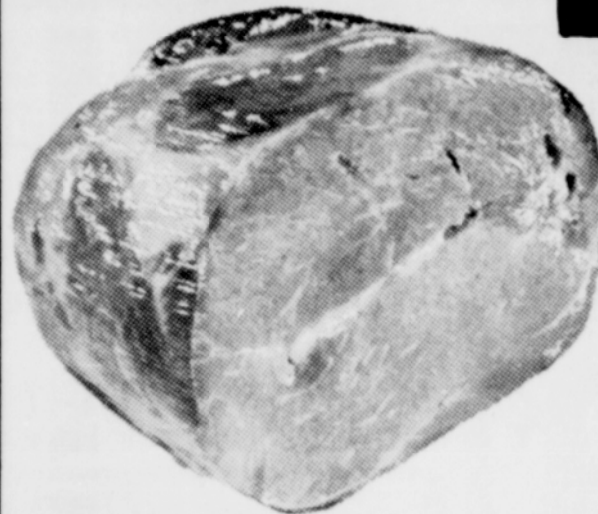
Increases on other driver license fees will range from a low of 50 cents to a high of \$6. An instruction permit to learn to drive will increase from \$1 to \$3. An original driver's license fee will range from \$3 to \$6, depending on how near the applicant's birthdate is when the license is issued. It

will cost \$4 to renew a driver's license. The \$1 increase is the first basic driver license fee increase since 1922. The highest fee increase will be for reinstatement of a license that has been suspended. That fee will go from \$2 to \$8 with the added fee intended to cover costs of personal service of suspension notices when a certified mail notice is returned by the post office. Other fees to be collected are: original chauffeur license, \$2 to \$6, depending on the applicant's birthdate; combined original driver-chauffeur

license, \$5 to \$12, depending on the applicant's birthdate; combined chauffeur renewal, \$4 to \$8, depending on the applicant's birthdate; duplicate license, \$2 to \$4, depending on the applicant's birthdate; cost for obtaining a driving record, \$2 to \$4, depending on the applicant's birthdate. The agency estimates the fee changes will produce additional \$2.48 million in revenue during the 1973-75 biennium. The changes will mean the agency will no longer have to "borrow" motor vehicle registration to support driver license activities.

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
