The luncheon will be held at 12:30 p.m. at T.J.'s in Sandy. Invited to attend.

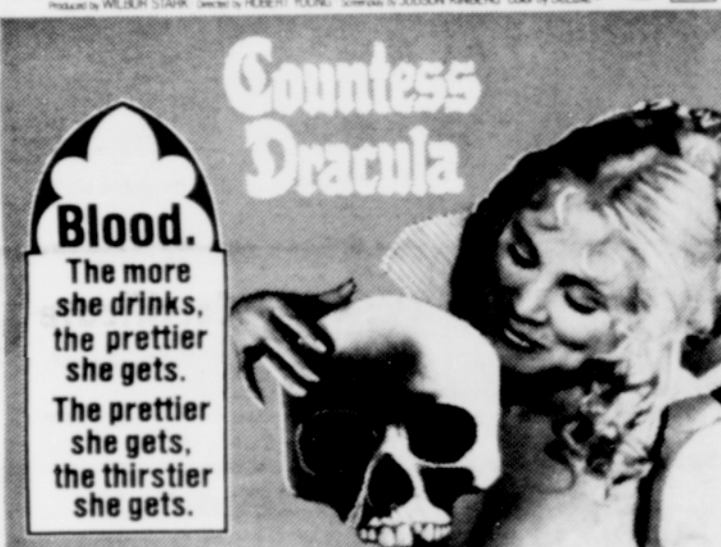
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Clarence Mayfield
