## LDS break ground for new chapel

Tuesday the Sandy Ward of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints Portland Stake broke ground for their new chapel in Sandy. This event was a long time coming for the Sandy residents.

The chapel is to be located on the west side of Bluff Rd. and construction is now underway. The new chapel is expected to be ready sometime late Spring 1974, according to church officials. Until that time, services will continue at the present location at the corner of Main St. and Beer St. in Sandy.

The present home is not the first for the Sandy Ward, there have been several moves since the local church began in 1957. The present membership has grown to 430 from the 200 who began the local church in 1957.

On June 16, 1967, the Sandy Branch of The Northwestern States Mission Mt. Hood District was started with Robert Pickell as the first Branch President and Ramon W. House and Elmer B. Buhler as his counselors, with Everett B. Nordin as clerk.

There were approximately 200 members when the branch started. They first met in The

Odd Fellows Hall in Sandy then they moved out to The Sandy Ridge School House until the school was needed for classroom space by the Sandy Grade School. They then moved to the Odd Fellows Hall.

In 1966, they went to Gresham where they shared the Gresham L.D.S. chapel with the Gresham and Rockwood wards. They only stayed there about a year. They were able to use the Sandy Ridge School House again until 1969 when they moved to their present location.

In 1966 the local church became part of the Portland Stake and no longer part of the mission. The branch presidency has had several changes in the past years.

Included in the list of past presidents are Ramon House, Elmer B. Buhler, Gilford Tuttle Jr., Keith Lloyd, and Loyal S. Zaugg.

Zaugg became the current president, now know as bishop, on Aug. 15, 1971.

**ZUCCHINIOMELET**  
1 lb. zucchini cut-up  
1 onion minced  
1 green pepper, chopped  
1/4 cup oil

**BLUEBERRY MUFFINS**  
2 cups flour  
One-third cup sugar  
3 teaspoons baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt  
1 cup milk  
One-third cup oil or butter  
1 egg, slightly beaten  
1 1/2 cups blueberries  
Pre heat oven to 400 degrees.  
Grease bottoms of 14 (2 1/2") muffin tins.  
Sift flour with sugar, baking powder, and salt into a large bowl. Measure milk into 2 cup measure. Add oil and egg, beat

with fork to mix well. Make a well in center of flour mixture. Pour in milk. Mix all at once. Stir to moisten. Don't beat. Batter will be lumpy. Add blueberries. Using 1/4 cup, fill each muffin cup. Sprinkle with a little sugar before baking. Bake 20 minutes or until golden brown. Serve hot with butter. Serves 7-8.—
