During Portland Chamber of Commerce's meeting Monday, Dr. Leo Marlanes, academic affairs dean, was taken back to 1921. During the chamber's gathering, the top Oregonian and Oregon Journal delivery boys were recognized. Persons in the audience were then requested to stand if they had been paperboys.

Dr. Marlanes stood and was one of the last five to be seated as the year they began was called off. He later remarked that he used to sell the evening paper on the streets in Seaside at the age of five. "It's been so long, I don't even remember which paper it was," he added.

Mt. Hood College Center at Maywood Park will host Wednesday's monthly gathering of the District Board of Education. The Center opened its doors last month and the student turnout has been most rewarding. Being the first of several planned extension centers of the college, a board meeting was set for the facility today to acquaint members with the "new college." An open house at the Center is on the agenda for next month.
