What's Cooking?

Susan Krick, chairman of the St. Michael's Guild Cookbook Committee, called me last week to get some of my favorite recipes. In turn, I asked for some of her favorites.

The Guild plans to have their cookbook off the press by Thanksgiving. Those of you who like to collect local recipes will want to watch for it.

GREEN PEPPER STEAK

1 round steak cut in serving pieces
1 onion chopped
1 can broth, add 1/2 cup water
1 Tablespoon Worcestershire Sauce
1 cup red wine
Salt and pepper to taste
3 green peppers
Brown meat and onions and add liquids and seasoning. Simmer until tender. Add three green peppers cut in strips over the top and heat through.

Thinly by adding a little cold water to some flour in a cup, mix thoroughly, and add to hot mixture stirring constantly. This is delicious served on mashed potatoes.—From the files of Mrs. Edward Krick, Sandy.

MOTHER'S TUNA CASSEROLE

1 can mushroom soup
1/4 cup milk
1/4 cup minced onion
1 cup chopped celery
1 cup cashew nuts
1 (6 1/2 oz.) can tuna
1 large can snow mein noodles
Mix first six ingredients together. Butter a baking dish and place one generous layer of chow mein noodles on bottom of it, then a layer of the tuna mixture. Top with another layer of noodles. Bake 40 minutes at 325 degrees. Serves 4-6.—From the files of Mrs. Edward Krick, Sandy.

BLUEBERRY COFFEE CAKE

1/4 cup sugar
1/4 cup soft shortening
1 egg
1/2 cup milk
2 cups flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
Pinch of salt
2 cups blueberries
Mix sugar, shortening and egg. Stir in milk, flour, baking powder and salt. Fold in blueberries. Put in greased 9"x13" pan.
TOPPING: 1 cup sugar, 2-3 cup flour, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 cup soft butter. Combine ingredients. Sprinkle on cake batter. Bake at 350 degrees for 50 minutes. Serves 8-10.—From the files of Mrs. Edward Krick, Sandy.

PRUNE CAKE

1 cup butter, margarine, or Wesson oil
4 eggs
1 cup stewed dried prunes (mashed)
1 Tablespoon soda
1 Tablespoon cinnamon
1 teaspoon nutmeg
1 teaspoon cloves
2 cups sugar
2 and two-thirds cups flour
1 cup buttermilk
1 teaspoon baking powder
Cream butter and sugar. Add eggs one at a time, then buttermilk. Mix and sift together all dry ingredients. Add the dry mixture and prunes. Cook in three greased and floured cake pans at 350 degrees until cake tests done.

1 can frozen orange juice (undiluted)

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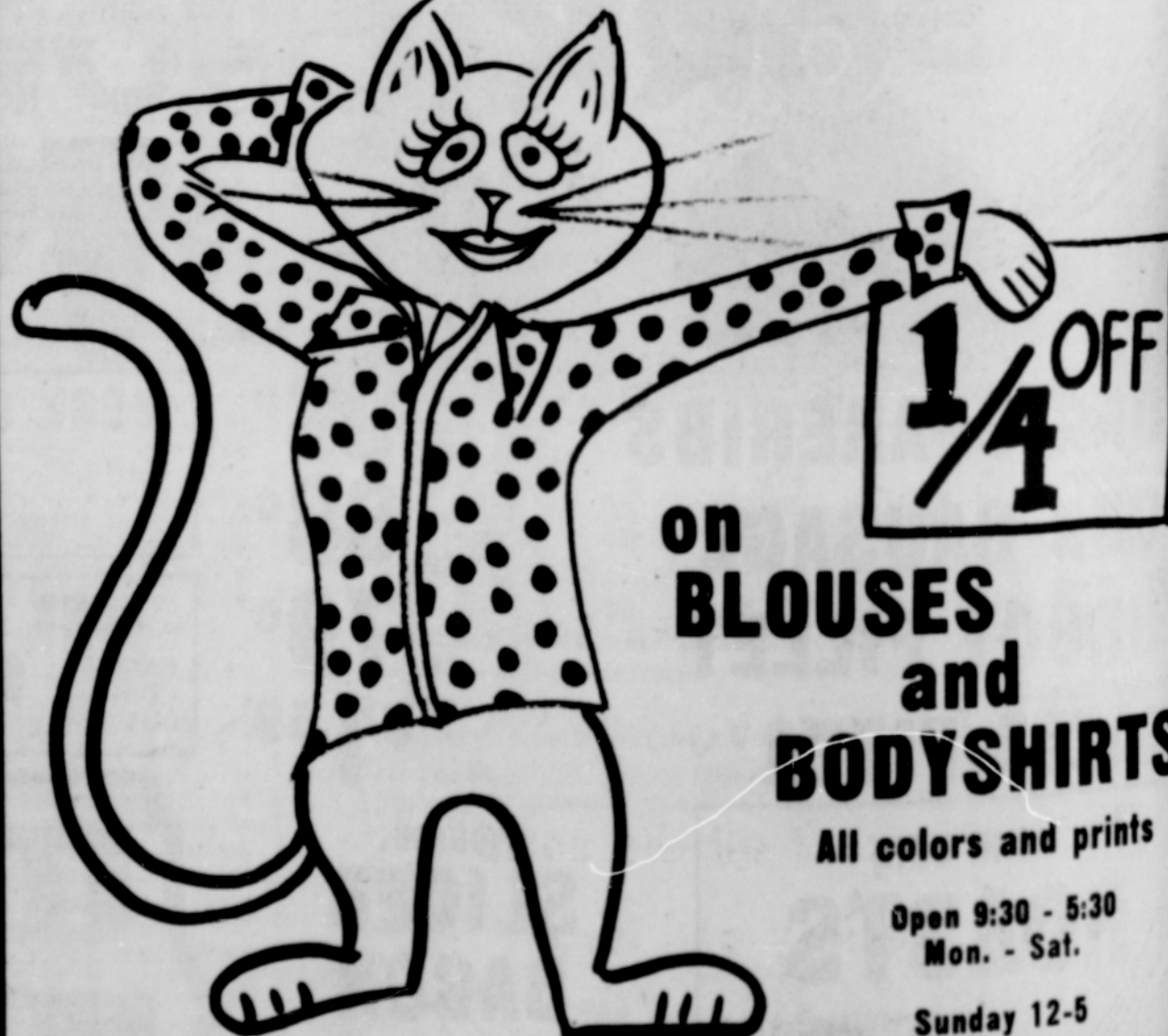
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
