Mark Vendshus of Portland will speak at the meeting on the United Nations and the future of world government. Vendshus was recently delegated to spend a month studying at the United Nations by the Odd Fellows, for the purpose of traveling and speaking to

various organizations about the United Nations, under the direction of the United Nations Association of America.

Miss Mary Jo Morton, chairman of the Clackamas County Baha'i Eastern Teaching Committee, stated that the Baha'i International Community has consultative

status with the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations. The U.S. Baha'i Community has an accredited Non-Governmental Organization (NGO) representative at the United Nations. "The Baha'i Faith," Miss Morton pointed out, "has taken an active interest in support of

the United Nations since its founding. The role of the United Nations in accelerating the economic progress of developing countries and in the promotion of universal education, universal human rights, and world law is supported and endorsed by the Baha'is."

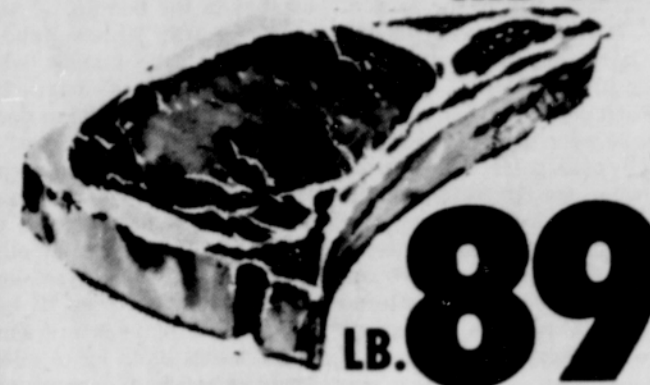
Rape suspect arrested Sunday
