What's Cooking?

One of the projects on the Sewell family farm is raising thoroughbred whiteface Hereford cattle. When my brother, George, and his family came to visit us in the summer of 1972 his wife, Una, brought me some of her favorite beef recipes.

They were given to her by members of the Alabama CowBelles and Alabama Cattlemen's Association, of which they also are members.

BEEF AND PINEAPPLE
4 lbs. beef pot roast (rump or chuck)

1 Tablespoon shortening
1 large onion, chopped
1 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 teaspoon celery salt
1 Tablespoon lemon juice
1 cup boiling water
1 No. 2 can pineapple chunks, drained

Brown beef on all sides in hot shortening. Add onions, seasonings, lemon juice and water. Place drained pineapple chunks over beef. Cover and cook slowly for about 3 hours or until beef is tender. Check occasionally to see if more water is needed. Strain pineapple chunks from liquid and arrange around beef on platter. Thicken gravy with a little flour mixed with water and serve separately. Serves 4 to 6.—From the files of Mrs. Nancy Quinn, Prattville, Ala.

CRANBERRY POT ROAST
3 lbs. beef pot roast (chuck or shoulder)

1 medium onion
2 teaspoons salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper
1 teaspoon celery salt
1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
1/4 cup boiling water
2 cups cranberries (fresh cranberries, which have been cooked and sweetened to taste or 1 can of whole cranberry sauce)

Sprinkle meat tenderizer over beef 20 minutes before cooking time and let stand at room temperature until cooking time. Brown beef on all sides. Add onions, seasonings, Worcestershire sauce, and water. Place one cup cranberries over beef. Cover and cook in oven very slowly (300 to 325 degrees) for 2 hours or until beef is tender. After beef has cooked an hour, place the

remainder of the cranberries on beef. Check occasionally to see if more water is needed. Drain cranberries from liquid and arrange on meat. Garnish with parsley. Thicken gravy with a little flour (1 Tablespoon flour to 1 cup liquid) mixed with water, stir until gravy thickens and serve separately.—From the files of Mrs. Jean Wilson, Holtville, Ala. SWEDISH MEAT LOAF
1 can Cream of Mushroom soup

1 1/2 lbs ground beef
1 egg, slightly beaten
1/2 cup finely crushed herb seasoning stuffing
1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
1/2 cup sour cream

Mix thoroughly beef, egg, stuffing, nutmeg, and 1-3 can soup. Shape firmly into loaf, place in shallow baking pan. Bake at 350 degrees for one hour. Blend remaining soup and sour cream. Heat, stirring occasionally. Do not allow to boil. Pour sauce over meat loaf, or serve separately. Serve cucumber slices with meat loaf. CHERRY NUT CAKE
1 1/2 cups sugar
1/2 cup shortening
Pinch salt
1 teaspoon vanilla
3 egg whites
2 1/2 cups sifted flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
3/4 cup English walnuts
4 oz. jar maraschino cherries

Pour off liquid from maraschino cherries and finish filling cup with sweet milk. Cut up nuts and cherries. Cream sugar and shortening, add vanilla. Sift dry ingredients and add alternately with milk-cherry juice mixture. Add nuts and cherries and fold in beaten egg whites last. Bake in either a long 9"x13" greased and floured pan or in 2 9" cake pans. If baking in the long pan cook at 350 degrees for 40-45 minutes and when cool frost with a thin coat of powdered sugar frosting made by mixing 1 or 2 Tablespoons butter with some sifted powdered sugar, 1 teaspoon vanilla and a little cream or milk to make spreading consistency. If baking in layers, they make a lovely pink birthday cake which should be frosted with
